Hi Peter,

The preferred fire trail route to the north east as indicated by Rod Rose (and shown on attached map) has the least ecological impact in order to achieve an appropriate bushfire outcome.

While there are still some relatively minor impacts on one Endangered Ecological Community and riparian area, it is my opinion that the preferred fire trail route could be supported by an environmental assessment as long as other riparian areas and associated vegetation of conservation significance in Stage 5 are retained and enhanced, and the trail is designed and constructed to minimise impacts on these features.
