The purpose of the meeting is to brief the PAC on the modification proposal.

A general briefing of the operation was provided along with a history of the area and the adjoining two mines.

The main points of discussion are outlined below:

- the history of the subject, and adjoining Ulan and Moolarben mine complexes;
- nine private land owners in village of Wollar
- The three mining complexes have contributed towards the \$28 million road upgrades;
- The site has a low strip ratio;
- \$1 million has been spent on exploration modelling this year;
- The market is driving blending ratio's (ash content);
- The main source of spontaneous combustion odour is the Keylah dump which was placed in 2007 and contains approximately 1.2 cubic million tonne of material;
- The mine has commenced removal of the Keylah dump to mitigate spontaneous combustion odours;

The proponent provided a power point presentation (refer **Appendix 1**).

Between 3.00 pm to 4.30 pm a site visit was conducted. Following the site visited, the briefing returned to the site office for further discussion.
