RE: Consolidated Response to Submissions on s75W Modification (MP_0024_MOD4) Highview Drive, Dolphin Point

I refer to the s75 W application to modify the existing subdivision approval currently being assessed by the NSW Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) and the DPE's request for a consolidated response to submissions received.

It is understood that the only two outstanding matters identified in submissions from Shoalhaven City Council (SCC) and NSW Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) relate to the initial proposal to delete the following provisions from the Statement of Commitments:

Following further consultation with Council and NSW OEH we suggest the following modifications to the commitments relating to the implementation and management of the Leaflless Tongue Orchid and White -footed Dunnart in the Barnunj Reserve. Essentially, we are now proposing retention of the commitments but rather than managing the process (on a location which is off site and out of our ownership/control), that the funding specified be provided to OEH in order to prepare an implement the relevant plans. Accordingly, the following amended provisions are now proposed (instead of deletion as originally proposed):

off site and it would appear that this work would be better undertaken by the relevant managing authority for the State Conservation Area.

It is suggested that a more practical approach to this matter would be for the developer to supply funding to the relevant authorities to pursue the management plan and

implementation. Therefore, it is proposed that \$15,000.00 be paid to the relevant authority to undertake this work.

The proponent has already increased the buffer area to the Barnunj State Conservation Area within the development site and has existing management conditions applying to the conservation area within the subject site.

The Statement of Commitments also contains provisions for a vegetation management plan which are already in place. The development site has ongoing monitoring by Lesryk under this VMP.

It is considered that the provision of funds for this work to the relevant authorities/landowners will be a more beneficial exercise as it will allow for a more streamlined approach to the control of the site and cut out costly consultation with the

The background to the commitments for the orchid should be considered in light of the history of this subdivision. Originally the application proposed translocation of orchids as the orchids were within the proposed residential portion. This was subsequently changed when the consent plans included the broader reserve area. The monitoring and implementation of plans relating to monitoring largely related to the relocation proposal. Regardless of this we are seeking approval to provide funding only for these monitoring and implementation plans so that the relevant management authority for the Barnunj Reserve can undertake the management.

It is understood that all other matters have now been resolved and we would therefore request that should NSW DPE approve this application that a consolidated approval be issued.
