These are dubious claims offered to blind authorities with the sole aim of obtaining approvals. This type of dust becomes an integral part of air and most of it continues to travel with it. Inhalation of silica dust by residents within a few kms of the plant, in decreasing severity with distance, is certainly unavoidable if this plant comes into existence.
