Subject: Modification Request - Toxfree (MP 06_0095 MOD 3)

I refer to the submission of an Environmental Assessment (EA) prepared in support of your request to modify the Project Approval (MP 06_0095) for the Toxfree waste treatment and storage facility at St Mays.

The Department has considered the details provided within the EA and notes that the proposal would significantly increase the quantities of Dangerous Goods to be stored at the site. In addition, a new treatment process would be introduced (Acid Alkaline Neutralisation).

To assist in the assessment of your modification, it is requested that you revise the EA to include the following additional information:

- a detailed locality plan including the site, nearby watercourses, industrial buildings, shopping and employment areas, hospitals, schools and transport routes;
- a preliminary hazard analysis (PHA) prepared in accordance with Hazardous Industry Planning Advisory Paper No. 6 - Guidelines for Hazard Analysis. The PHA should, in particular:
 - o estimate the risks from the proposed modification, the existing site and the overall site;
 - identify the hazards, arising out of the proposed modification and the existing site as well as any external hazards (i.e. natural hazards) to determine the potential for off-site impacts;
 - o provide more detailed information on the Acid Alkaline Neutralisation process and equipment;
 - critically review the chemical reaction and the chemical products (including any intermediates) related to the Acid Alkaline Neutralisation and establish the probability of formation of toxic gases;
 - evaluate the probability of a failure of the proposed scrubber and estimate the potential impacts; and
 - demonstrate that the proposed development complies with the criteria set out in *Hazardous Industry Planning Advisory Paper No 4 - Risk Criteria for Land Use Safety Planning.*
- details of the gases which would be treated within the proposed scrubbing system and potential air emissions following treatment.
