Hello Dave,

My return to work was held up for longer than I had thought I apologise for the delay in getting formal comment to you on the changes to the Grandfathers Gully development.

I confirm as per our discussions on 20 January 2009 regarding the modifications to the subdivision plans that;

- the changes to the subdivision layout require no additional clearing of native vegetation to be undertaken, and
- the changes to the layout of the blocks and therefore changes to the placement for a some of the building envelopes has resulted in the retained vegetation and regeneration areas having an increased value to native wildlife as a corridor.

In summary the Southern Rivers CMA believes that the development proposal at Grandfathers Gully still adequately meets the 'improve or maintain' test under the Native Vegetation Act 2003.
