



#### Legend

- Rehabilitation and strengthening of existing native vegetation areas. This is currently taking place successfully where fencing has been installed
  - Existing fencing erected on site at the end of 2007. At its closest point to Moonee Creek it is 20 metres from the top of the bank.
- The purpose of the fencing is to control stock from entering the river bank environment.
- The current fence consists of 4 strand barbed wire, with timber straining posts and star picket intermediate posts
- Proposed future fencing will utilise existing alignment and timber posts but be replaced with fencing that:
- Consists of timber intermediate posts and hinge wire fencing that is better designed to restrict pedestrian access (refer fence detail)
  - Negates dog access
  - Allows wildlife movement
  - Is strong and aesthetically works within the natural setting of Moonee Creek
- Vehicular access points located along fence will remain as indicated for maintenance purposes.
- Vehicular gate, padlocked, access allowed for maintenance
