Conditions that we propose that be made binding on Newcrest in their application to extend tonnage being extracted from Cadia East.

1) Powerline.

If in the future Newcrest determines that their power needs cannot be met by the existing power and a new line is required from Orange to Cadia THE NEW LINE MUST GO UNDERGROUND.

2) Rehab to restore rock dump area to original condition:-

Very strict conditions must be placed on this rehab area and not be allowed to become infested with biddy bush and wattle scrub.

These areas prior to mining contained some of the most productive land in the Orange district.

3) Traffic on the Cadia road:-

Even though the road is being widened and resheeted the impact on residents entering the roadway is huge. More trucks more speed because of the better road conditions. The speed limit must be reduced to 80.

4) The mental impact being loaded on to residents by the impact of the Cadia Mine tragically is becoming very real. Subsidised garbage collection, glazing of house windows and advice from an agronomist is not the answer. Being honest with residents in group form (not one on one) is needed.
