SCHEDULE 2

ADMINISTRATIVE CONDITIONS

OBLIGATION TO MINIMISE HARM TO THE ENVIRONMENT

1. The Proponent shall implement all reasonable and feasible measures to prevent and/or minimise any harm to the environment that may result from on site works.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

- 2. Project approval is granted for the Project Application, referred to as 'Stage 1' Environmental Works in the Concept Plan, as generally described below:
 - a) Vegetation Management
 - the establishment of a 'vegetated regeneration area' extending westward of the mapped boundary of the SEPP26 Littoral Rainforest
 - removal of all weed species and retention of all native vegetation within regeneration area
 - replanting of endemic rainforest species within regeneration area
 - b) Erection of temporary fencing
 - erection of fencing enclosing regeneration area.
 - c) Construction of pedestrian boardwalk
 - construction of raised pedestrian boardwalk through SEPP26 Littoral Rainforest to connect to public foreshore at Rainbow Beach.

PROJECT STAGING

- 3. The project is to be undertaken in stages generally described in the Environmental Assessment and comprises the following stages:
 - 1) <u>Stage 1</u> Weeding, establishment of colonising vegetation and feeding resources and erection of temporary fencing
 - 2) <u>Stage 2</u> Ongoing weeding, introduction of long lived rainforest species, construction of pedestrian boardwalk
 - Stage 3 Planting associated with biofiltration pond edges, ongoing rehabilitation of regeneration area.

Note: The construction of the pedestrian boardwalk is to be completed prior the completion of concept plan Stages M2 or S2.

TERMS OF APPROVAL

- 5. The Proponent shall carry out the project generally in accordance with the:
 - a) Environmental Assessment
 - b) Plans noted in Condition 4 above
 - c) Response to Submissions Report
 - d) Statement of Commitments (see Appendix 1)
 - e) Conditions of this approval.
- 6. If there is any inconsistency between the above documents, the most recent document shall prevail to the extent of the inconsistency. The conditions of this approval shall prevail to the extent of any inconsistency.
- 7. The Proponent shall comply with any reasonable requirement/s of the Director-General arising from the Department's assessment of:
 - a) any reports, plans, programs, strategies or correspondence that are submitted in accordance with this approval
 - b) the implementation of any actions or measures contained in these reports, plans, programs, strategies or correspondence submitted by the Proponent.

LIMITS OF APPROVAL

- 8. This approval only relates to the site, as described in the Response to Submissions Report.
- 9. This approval shall lapse if work has not physically commenced the project associated with this approval within 5 years from the date of this approval.

OPERATION OF PLANT AND EQUIPMENT

- 10. The Proponent shall ensure that all plant and equipment used for the Project is:
 - a) maintained in a proper and efficient condition
 - b) operated in a proper and efficient manner.

SCHEDULE 3

ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT CONDITIONS

PEDESTRIAN BOARDWALK

- 11. Prior to the issue of a Construction Certificate, detailed plans of the pedestrian boardwalk shall be submitted to and approved by Council. The design of the boardwalk must be designed in a manner to protect the SEPP26 Littoral Rainforest while facilitating pedestrian access through to the public foreshore. Details are to include, but not be limited to:
 - design and materials details of the boardwalk and the self closing gate at the entrance of the walkway
 - construction details outlining proposed depths of footings and measures to protect roots of existing vegetation.

ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT

- All affected trees within the SEPP26 Littoral Rainforest are to suitably protected by way of tree guards, barriers or other measures as necessary to protect roots, trunks and branches during construction of the project. Remnant vegetation is to be protected and signage erected to ensure the preservation of the rainforest.
- An appropriately qualified bush regenerator shall be present on site when weeds marked for removal are removed.
- 14. Feral deer control shall be undertaken by a suitably qualified shooter working under the auspices of the NSW Game Council.

ABORIGINAL CULTURAL HERITAGE

- 15. Should any future works associated with the site uncover evidence of any unexpected Aboriginal archaeological site or relic, all work likely to affect that site or relic must cease immediately. Temporary fencing must be erected around the find and the material must be identified by an independent and appropriately qualified archaeologist. The Office of Environment and Heritage must be notified as soon as possible who will then advise of the most appropriate course of action to follow. Works must not resume at the location without the prior written consent of the Office of Environment and Heritage.
- 16. All construction personnel involved in initial ground surface disturbance activities shall undergo an Indigenous Cultural Heritage Induction training session before commencing any construction activities. The Induction should be presented by an appropriately qualified person and provide specific information in relation to the processes to be followed should any Indigenous items be uncovered as well as the types of and identification criteria for cultural heritage material that may be uncovered.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT

- 17. The Council shall be given written notice of the commencement of works at least 48 hours prior to works commencement.
- 18. The hours of construction for the project, including the delivery of materials to and from the site, shall be restricted as follows:
 - a) between 7:00 am and 5:00 pm, Mondays to Friday, inclusive
 - b) between 8:00am and 1:00pm on Saturdays
 - c) at no time on Sundays and public holidays.
- During construction, the Proponent shall:

- a) Prominently display a site notice for the purposes of informing the public of project details including, but not limited to:
 - i) details of the Proponent, contractor and PCA
 - ii) the approved hours of work
 - iii) contact details for the site manager and/or liason manager for any inquiries or complaints.
- b) provide a copy of the approved and certified plans and conditions of approval on site.
- c) carry out all reasonable and feasible measures to minimise soil erosion.
- d) ensure that all vehicles leaving the site do not track dirt on the public road network.
