Sandon Point Project Approval MP07_0032 Condition C19 –Road Upgrade Works

As you are aware Stockland has been consulting with the Roads and Traffic Authority (RTA) over the past months regarding the design of the road upgrade works and construction traffic access options in order to address the requirements of Condition C19 of the Project Approval for Sandon Point.

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The consulting process between the RTA and Stockland has taken the form of various emails and correspondences and progressively an agreement has been reached between the RTA and Stockland regarding the road upgrade works and construction traffic access arrangements. These agreements do not strictly comply with the requirements of Conditions C19. Stockland is therefore proposes to submit an application under Section 75W of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act, 1979 in the near future to modify the Project Approval in line with the agreement reached between the RTA and Stockland.

The purpose of this letter is to summarise the agreements reached with the RTA and to seek the RTA's written confirmation regarding the agreed position. This will assist in clearly communicating to the Department of Planning the outcome that has been agreed between the RTA and Stockland.

Lawrence Hargrave Drive and Wrexham Road intersection design and RTA consultation

Layout plans of the proposed upgrade were provided to the RTA in October 2010. The plans show the following arrangement:

- An upgrade of Lawrence Hargrave Drive from High Street to Lachlan Street including:
 - Two north bound through lanes (one being a dedicated through lane the other a combined through lane with right hand turn option into Wrexham Road)
 - One south bound through lane
 - o One south bound left turn lane into Wrexham Road
- Three lanes in Wrexham Road (including two west bound and one eastbound)



 A signalised intersection at the junction of Lawrence Hargrave Drive and Wrexham Road (with the lane arrangement described above accommodating the three phased arrangement).

On the 6th October 2010, the RTA confirmed that the above lane arrangement and intersection design was acceptable subject to further development of some minor detailed design matters. On 29 November 2010, Cardno provided to the RTA a revised Detailed Design submission for the RTA's approval including amendments to address the RTA's concept design review comments. A copy of the layout plans are attached at **Attachment 1**. Stockland is therefore seeking the RTA's confirmation that the above lane arrangement is satisfactory.

Construction Access

Condition C19 is worded such that Lawrence Hargrave Drive needs to be upgraded before traffic can access the site via Wrexham Road. This includes construction traffic which presents difficulties for Stockland to readily and logically stage its construction program, significantly delaying works at the northern end of the site.

In order to resolve construction access issues, Stockland has been consulting with the RTA to find an acceptable arrangement and the following chain of correspondence documents the exchanges between Stockland and the RTA regarding this matter:

- Letter dated 20 October 2010 from Stockland to the RTA (Attachment 2);
- Letter dated 27 October 2010 from the RTA to Stockland in response to Stockland's letter of 20 October 2010 (Attachment 3);
- Email dated 28 October 2010 from Stockland to the RTA (Attachment 4);
- Letter dated 1 November 2010 from the RTA to Stockland in response to Stockland's email of 28 October 2010 (Attachment 5);
- Email dated 11 November 2010 from Stockland to the RTA addressing concerns raised in the RTA's letter of 1 November 2010 (Attachment 6);
- Further email dated 25 November 2010 from Stockland to the RTA addressing concerns raised in the RTA's letter of 1 November 2010 (Attachment 7); and
- Email dated 29 November 2010 from the RTA to Stockland agreeing to an alternative solution proposed by Stockland (Attachment 8).

The RTA raised concerns regarding construction access using the current configuration of Wrexham Road/Lawrence Hargrave Drive, particularly in relation to restricted sight distance for vehicles turning right from Lawrence Hargrave Drive into Wrexham Road. In order to address the traffic safety issues Stockland suggested a number of options. The preferred option involves the following:

- Traffic controllers controlling the south bound traffic as northbound vehicles are preparing to turn right into Wrexham Road (a method used by RTA contractors during the recent construction of Lawrence Hargrave Drive); and
- Approximately 30 heavy vehicle 'deliveries' between 7am to 12noon and 10 heavy vehicle 'deliveries' between 12noon and 2pm.

The RTA in its email of 29 November 2010 (Attachment 8) responded to Stockland's proposal outlined in its email of 25 November 2010 and agreed as follows:



"The RTA does not object to these arrangements, noting that they will not commence until works on Lawrence Hargrave Drive/Wrexham Road associated with the WAD have commenced, they will only be heavy vehicle movements (of approximately 40 deliveries per day) and there will be no deliveries after 2pm."

Stockland understands that the RTA is now satisfied with this alternative arrangement to construction traffic access and Stockland is therefore seeking the RTA's confirmation that the RTA does not object to the above traffic management arrangements.

As stated earlier, the purpose of this letter is simply to summarise the agreements reached with the RTA. Stockland is therefore seeking the RTA's written confirmation regarding the agreed position. We look forward to your earliest response to this letter so that Stockland can submit as section 75W modification application to the Department of Planning.

Reference is made to your letter dated 20 October 2010 regarding the application for a Section 75W amendment to Condition C19 of the development approval (MP07-0032).

The RTA has reviewed your submission. Whilst the RTA has no objection to the amendment for the changed lane configurations on Lawrence Hargrave Drive, the RTA has the following concerns:

Prior to any residential traffic assessing the proposal via Wrexham Road

The RTA cannot support the proposition of construction traffic utilising the Wrexham Road intersection prior to traffic signal installation. Restricted sight distance at this intersection makes this proposition unacceptable. As you would be aware, the RTA has previously raised issues with the lack of sight distance for vehicles turning right from Lawrence Hargrave Drive into Wrexham Road. In this regard, sight distance would be restricted by northbound vehicles, particularly by higher vehicles, queued back from the Phillip Street traffic signals. This is why the RTA would not accept an intersection design that relied on a filter arrangement.

• A short (approximately twenty metre) left hand turn slip lane into Wrexham Road

As detailed in the previous design comments, the left hand turn slip lane needs to be at least 35m in length (20m for the left hand turn bay, and 15m for the taper on approach to the bay).

• All works listed in a, b, c and d are to have commenced prior to subdivision certificate for stage I can be issued.

The RTA does not object to this point, provided it is amended to the following: all works listed in a, b, c and d are to have commenced prior to subdivision certificate for stage I can be issued and completed prior to any occupation (interim or final).

Thanks you for your prompt response with regards to my letter dated 22 October 2010.

As it was discussed yesterday, it is critical that we can get construction traffic accessing Lawrence Hargrave Drive via Wrexham Road. Our only access is via Lane 52 which is directly connected to Hewitts Creek. Unless we can organise an alternate access, we will not be able to complete our creek works in which it will delay our stage 1 registration.

I take on board your comments regarding the safety aspect of vehicular access to Lawrence Hargrave Drive and Wrexham Road with out the traffic signals operating. If we can agree that a left in-left out arrange in Wrexham Road for construction traffic only until the lights are operation, that would assist greatly in allowing our contractor to complete the civil works.

I suggest a site meeting to assess the situation would help determine a satisfactory resolution.

Reference is made to your email dated 28 October 2010 regarding the application for a Section 75W amendment to Condition C19 of the development approval (MP07-0032).

Whilst the RTA understands the reasoning behind a 'left-in, left-out' proposal for construction traffic at the intersection of Lawrence Hargrave Drive and Wrexham Road, the RTA has two significant concerns with the proposal. Specifically, how will Stocklands ensure compliance with the left in/left out arrangement (for all road users) and what the alternate turning arrangements arrangements are proposed, particularly for vehicles accessing the site from the south.

In this regard, in order for the RTA to consider the left in/left out proposal, the RTA requires a traffic management plan (TMP) detailing the proposed arrangements. This should include details of daily and peak traffic volumes for lights vehicles and heavy vehicles. Once this information is received, the RTA will review your proposal and make an assessment on the suitability of the proposed left in left out arrangement.

I refer to your correspondence dated 1 November 2010, with regards to the left-in/left-out arrangement at the above mentioned intersection.

Our preliminary investigation has resulted in several options that may be adopted as a suitable arrangement to manage the north bound traffic travelling along Lawrence Hargrave Drive, to enable a safe entrance into Wrexham Road.

Option 1:

- * Left turn into High Street
- * Right in Pass Avenue
- * Right into Lachlan Street and
- * Right into Lawrence Hargrave Drive.

Option 2:

- Left turn into High Street
- * Right in Pass Avenue
- * Through to Kelton lane
- * Right into George Street
- * Right into Lawrence Hargrave Drive using the signals on Phillip Street Refer to attached sketch illustrating the 2 options described above.

Option 3:

This would require, installing temporary traffic signals (24hrs/ day) on Lawrence Hargrave Drive to permit right the north bound vehicles a hand turn into Wrexham Road Option 4: Having traffic controllers during the hours of operation and controlling the southbound traffic as north bound vehicle are preparing to enter Wrexham Road.

All 4 proposal do cause some inconvenience to the existing traffic conditions, but I feel that Option 4, would have the least impact to the community. This method will also allow the existing residents of Wrexham Road a safe entry/exit to their residence.

This method was also adopted by your contractors during the construction of Lawrence Hargrave Drive. I'll await for your response in order to give our contractors an instruction with regards to the above.



I refer to yesterday's (24/11/10) telephone conversation, with regards to resolving the issue of obtaining construction access through Wrexham Road.

Further to our discussion, the intension of using Wrexham Road is only to allow heavy vehicles and deliveries to site. Menai Civil has successfully been able to separate cars and utes to utilize Sturdee Avenue bridge access and all heavy vehicles and deliveries through Lane 52 as the formal construction access. Unfortunately, Lane 52 is connected to Hewitts Creek, when the creek works commences, this access will conflict with the construction activity (refer to attached masterplan to view arrangements between Lane 52 and Hewitt Creeks).

As discussed, we anticipate peak deliveries to be approximately 40 deliveries per day of supplies and equipment to the site. We expect the majority of delivery to occur between the hours of 7am-12noon (approx 30 deliveries) with the remaining 10 to occur between 12noon- 2.00pm. In order to manage the right turn vehicles we have offered to have traffic controllers managing the south bound traffic along Lawrence Hargrave Drive. In order to minimize disruption to the local community, it was agreed when construction commences of Lawrence Hargrave Drive and Wrexham Road, there would be traffic controllers on site and the heavy vehicles/deliveries can utilize Wrexham Road as a form of construction access to site.

Based on the above, we seek an agreement from the RTA that Stockland can proceed with the above mentioned arrangements.




