Dear Dinuka,

The Roads and Traffic Authority (RTA) is currently in the processes of forming the Ballina Bypass Alliance (BBA) for the construction of the Ballina Bypass, Pacific Highway Upgrade.

Following the meeting between the Department of Planning (DoP), the RTA and the BBA on December 12 on a range of matters, including the matter below, I am writing to request changes to a number of the Minister's Conditions of Approval (MCoA) for the Ballina Bypass Project (the Project).

Following design development in the costing stage of the Project, the BBA has identified the following MCoA that are not generally consistent with the MCoA imposed on recent RTA projects and that, in their current form will place significant constraints on construction of the Project. The BBA and RTA consider these changes to be consistent with current best practice and do not result in a decrease in environmental performance standards applied to the project.

The RTA and BBA consider that the intent of the Minister's conditions, to provide for positive outcomes for a range of potential environmental impacts, will not alter as a result of the proposed revisions. The revisions would assist to achieve construction goals while not impacting on the environmental outcomes that the RTA and BBA are committed to.

The attached table provides the existing conditions, the proposed revisions and a discussion detailing the justification associated with each proposed revision.

It is requested that the Director-General consider revising the MCoA to reflect the changes proposed in the attached table. We are happy to discuss the issues further with DOP. Where external or independent</li> </ul>	<p>The current condition refers to a "required" verbal response to a complaint within 2 hours during night-time works.</p> <p>The RTA's Ballina Bypass Alliance notes that through past experience, some complainants may prefer to go back to sleep after making a complaint rather than be disturbed again by a response from the project team.</p> <p>The RTA's Ballina Bypass Alliance proposes to offer complainants the option of a 2 hour turnaround response, or to be contacted at a more convenient time to the complainant, for example, the next day.</p> <p>The RTA considers that by replacing "required" with "offered" that this response mechanism will ultimately provide a more flexible stakeholder outcome, whilst maintaining a strict standard of response for those stakeholders who demand it.</p>

Therefore the RTA propose the addition of the clause "or that the locations have been agreed to by the Director-General." to provide for consultation between RTA/BBA and DoP to establish suitable locations for the above mentioned facilities.</p> <p>If the current criteria of Condition 85 cannot be met and such consultation is required, the RTA will clearly demonstrate to DoP how it will effectively manage any potential environmental impacts associated with any facility location not being in compliance with criteria a) to j).</p>
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
