I refer to your letter dated 5 March 2013 forwarded to Roads and Maritime Services (RMS) for consideration.

We understand that the proposed project is classified as a transitional Major Project under Part 3A of the Environmental Planning & Assessment Act 1979 and the Minister for Planning and Infrastructure is the approval authority. The Central Coast Sands Project (08_0173) seeks approval for:

- 1. The existing quarry and rehabilitation operations on Lot 33 DP 755246 & Part Lot 118 DP755246 Reservoir Road, Somersby, and
- 2. The extension of this quarry through a 25 metre wide vegetated strip of land on lot 33 and into an eight (8) hectare area of Part Lot 10 DP1090880 Keighley Road Somersby.

RMS Responsibilities and Obligations

Transport for NSW and RMS primary interests are in the road network, traffic and broader transport issues, particularly in relation to the efficiency and safety of the classified road system, the security of property assets and the integration of land use and transport.

In accordance with the *Roads Act 1993*, RMS has powers in relation to road works, traffic control facilities, connections to roads and other works on the classified road network. Keighley Road and Reservoir Road are local roads under the care and control of Gosford City Council, any

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connections or works will require Council's concurrence. Gosford City Council is the roads authority for all roads in the area.

In accordance with State Environmental Planning Policy (Mining, Petroleum Production and Extractive Industries) 2007 Clause 16(3), RMS is given the opportunity to review and provide comment on the subject project application.

RMS Response and Requirements

RMS has reviewed the information provided and has no objections to or requirements for the proposed development as it is considered the development will have no significant impact on the classified (State) road network.

Please consult with Gosford City Council for its requirements on the regional and local road network.
