





HTO Workers Compensation Policy

Following is a document from WorkCover supporting the Changes to Workers Compensation Policy Documentation.

What has changed?

From 4pm on 30 June 2008 employers will no longer be required to obtain a workers compensation insurance policy for workers if they pay, or expect to pay \$7,500 or less in annual wages. This includes private households employing domestic staff and paying \$7,500 or less in annual wages.

When will the changes take effect?

The changes will take effect for policies commencing on or after 4pm on 30 June 2008.

If your policy is due for renewal before 30 June 2008, you are required to renew the policy for 12 months and at expiry you can cancel the policy.

If your policy expires on or after 30 June 2008, you are required to maintain the policy until the policy expiry date, after which the policy can be cancelled.

Who needs a workers compensation policy?

From 4pm on 30 June 2008, you must take out a workers compensation insurance policy if:

you engage workers or contractors deemed to be workers and you pay, or expect to pay, more than \$7,500 a year in wages, or you engage apprentices or trainees, or you are a member of a Group for workers compensation purposes.

Penalties may apply in the event that you do not take out a workers compensation insurance policy.

Employers who paid \$7,500 or less in annual wages in 2007/08:

If you expect your circumstances to remain unchanged you will not require a workers compensation insurance policy from 30 June 2008, unless you engage an apprentice or trainee or are a member of a Group for workers compensation purposes. To finalise your policy, you simply need to complete and return your declaration of actual wages paid for the 2007/08-policy period. Your policy will not be renewed and you will no longer receive renewal notices. However, if at any time your circumstances change and you expect to pay more than \$7,500 in wages for the financial year, you will need to obtain a workers compensation policy.

If at any time in the future you expect to pay more than \$7,500 in wages for the financial year (1 July to 30 June), or you become a member of a Group for premium purposes or engage an apprentice or

trainee, contact a Scheme Agent immediately as you will then require a workers compensation insurance policy.

Penalties may apply if you fail to take out a workers compensation insurance policy.

If you expect to pay more than \$7,500 in annual wages over the next year you will need to complete and return your declaration of actual wages paid for the 2007/08-policy period and your wages estimate for 2008-09 and renew your policy as usual. You will also need to complete and submit your estimated wage declaration if your estimated wages are \$7,500 or less but you employ an apprentice or trainee or are a member of a group for workers compensation purposes. Details of apprentice wages must be noted on all wage declarations.

Employers who paid more than \$7,500 in annual wages in 2007/08:

If you expect your circumstances to remain unchanged you will still require a workers compensation insurance policy. To renew your policy, complete and return your wage estimate for 2008/09 as usual. You should also ensure you return your declaration of actual wages paid for the 2007/08-policy period.

If you expect to pay \$7,500 or less in wages over the next financial year, you will still need to complete and return your declaration of actual wages paid for the 2007/08-policy period and your wages estimate for 2008/09 to your Scheme Agent. Your policy will not be renewed if you meet the exemption conditions and you will no longer receive renewal notices. However, if at any time your circumstances change and you expect to pay more than \$7,500 in wages for the financial year, or you employ an apprentice or trainee or become a member of a Group for workers compensation purposes, you will need to obtain a workers compensation policy.

If at any time in the future you expect to pay more than \$7,500 in wages for the financial year (1 July to 30 June), or you become a member of a Group for workers compensation purposes or engage an apprentice or trainee, contact a Scheme Agent immediately as you will then require a workers compensation insurance policy.

Penalties may apply if you provide incorrect wage declarations or fail to take out a policy when you become aware that your wages will exceed \$7,500 per annum.

What if my circumstances change or I have underestimated my annual wages?

From 30 June 2008, you must contact a Scheme Agent immediately to take out a workers compensation insurance policy, if at any time it appears that you:

will pay more than \$7,500 in wages for the financial year to workers or contractors deemed to be workers;

you engage an apprentice/trainee or become a member of a Group for workers compensation purposes.

Penalties may apply in the event that you fail to take out a policy when you become aware that your wages will exceed \$7,500.

What happens if my worker makes a claim for compensation?

If you are an employer who pays wages of \$7,500 or less and are no longer required to hold a workers compensation insurance policy from 30 June 2008, your workers will still be covered.

If one of your workers makes a claim for workers compensation, you will need to contact WorkCover on 13 10 50 to report the claim. WorkCover will allocate a Scheme Agent to manage the claim. You will

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the draft report and management recommendations.

Generally, the Wanaruah LALC is in agreement with the findings of the report and we consider that the survey methodology used and the division of work between Land Council boundaries during the survey was appropriate. It is however considered (and recommended in this letter), that the areas not yet surveyed due to previous access inability should be inspected, as those properties become available for assessment.

This letter from the Wanaruah LALC does not express the views of any other Aboriginal stakeholder group or groups (whether their representatives are members of the Land Council or not). The comments provided are considered appropriate under the Aboriginal Land Rights Act 1983 in relation to the role of the Land Council in the promotion and protection of culture and heritage for all Aboriginal people within its boundary.

In relation to this review of the draft report, it must be noted that, the comments provided are in relation to the study area within the Wanaruah LALC boundary only and are given on behalf of those members of the Wanaruah LALC who choose not to speak independently in relation to the recommendations within the draft report or the project in general.

2

The following comments on the recommendations and mitigation strategies will only apply to the approximate 8km to 10km of the survey route between Black Creek and the western most section of the proposed railway works.

It is recommended that:

- Since it was recommended by Umwelt (2006b) that the Black Creek RTA2 site should be further investigated, this should be undertaken as a cultural excavation and salvage if the site is to be impacted by the rail construction work.
- All sites found and recorded within the immediate impact area along the survey route and locations assessed for compound areas (~ 24 sites may be impacted) are to be salvaged, regardless of whether they are scientifically significant or not. Other sites nearby which will not be impacted are to be protected by fencing and identified on the design plan with all contractors to be made aware of their location. The Aboriginal people consider that all sites regardless of size or content, are culturally significant as they are the last remaining evidence of their past ancestral cultural landscape and must be respected. The Wanaruah LALC is not prepared to comment further on the specific cultural significance of this part of the Wonnarua country.
- If there are properties within the Wanaruah LALC boundary that have not yet been surveyed because of access restrictions, they will need to be inspected as those properties become available for assessment.
- All artefacts that are salvaged within the Wangruah LALC boundary are to be temporarily located at the Land Council and their final interment place is to be determined by the Wonnarua Aboriginal stakeholders in consultation at a time to be agreed.
- With regard to future work on this project, the Wanaruah LALC wishes to be involved in all cultural heritage work (either survey or excavation) from the western end of the study area (Jump Up Creek) to Maitland.

With regard to other sites within the Mindaribba LALC boundary, consideration of their management is to be made by the other relevant aboriginal stakeholder groups,

in reply to the draft report on the above project in which Mindaribba Local Aboriginal land Council have been involved with. Several members have participated during the initial stages on surface surveys being conducted.

Discussions with some workers have taken place during the survey and they stated that during this project the consultant initially didn't give consideration to the concerns raised by M.L.A.L.C about methods in which work was being carried out. They have also said on occasions visibility was non-existent because of the vegetation.

We were also of the understanding that not all properties have had survey work done because of refusal by owners who wouldn't allow work to be conducted on their property. This is not satisfactory.

Contained within the report is Section 7.2 Significance of Heritage Evidence within the Study Area. This land is significant to Aboriginal people, especially to the Wonnarua people.

Work that was done in other areas, by the A.R.T.C., demonstrated that little respect was shown to sites and they were destroyed by poor planning and management by Hunter 8 Alliance group and A.R.T.C. The reason I raise this is, because in your report, the issue of Section 90 Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permit (AHIP) is suggested.

Your report also indicates that training be made available to contractors in Aboriginal heritage. This should happen, and then if they do what has been done in the past, destroy sites, then prosecution should take place.

M.L.A.L.C. recommends:

(1) That a meeting between proponent and stakeholders, along with South East Archaeology principal,

Peter Kuskie to discuss the recommendations and

- (2) Then when agreement has been reached between all involved we have a binding agreement drawn up, so that A.R.T.C. and Hunter 8 Alliance group are legally locked in to carrying out all work outlined by those present and
- (3) M.L.A.L.C. won't support Section 90 AHIP prior to meeting being held

DRAFT MAITLAND TO MINIMBAH THIRD TRACK ABORIGINAL HERITAGE IMPACT ASSESSMENT: REPORT FOR HERMITAGE ROAD, NELSON STREET AND STATION LANE, REVIEW OF ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the draft report, mitigation and management strategies and its recommendations.

This letter from the Wanaruah LALC does not express the views of any other Aboriginal stakeholder group or groups (whether their representatives are members of the Land Council or not) who have chosen to speak in their own right. The comments provided are considered appropriate under Clause No. 42(4)(a)and(b) of the Aboriginal Land Rights Act 1983 (and its amendments) in relation to the role of the Land Council in the protection and the promotion of awareness in the community of culture and heritage for Aboriginal people within its boundary.

In relation to this review of the draft report, it must be noted that the comments provided are in relation to the study area within the Wanaruah LALC boundary only, being the Hermitage Road study area between Belford and Pothana.

The Wanaruah LALC is in agreement with the findings of the draft report and we consider that the survey methodology used was appropriate. It is however considered (and recommended in this letter) that any areas not yet surveyed, within the Hermitage Road study area (identified in Figure 8), due to previous access inability should be inspected as those properties become available for assessment prior to any land clearing work commencing.

It has been reported that four artefact sites were found within the Hermitage Road study area (being Belford Rail 4, 8, 9 and 10) and that there is a possibility that these sites will be impacted, to a greater or lesser degree, by the railway construction project.

It is agreed that records have shown that small artefact sites are common within the Belford area and they have been considered as having low scientific significance. They still provide information to help fill in the gaps within the overall map of Aboriginal occupation in the Hunter Valley.

To the general contemporary Aboriginal community, all sites have cultural significance as they are links to departed traditional ancestors. The cultural heritage evidence found provides proof of their connection with the land which those ancestors hunted in, travelled through and lived.

Having taken into consideration Section 8 (Potential Mitigation and Management Strategy) and Section 9 (Recommendations), and the draft reports' assessment of low scientific significance, the Wanaruah LALC takes this opportunity to comment and recommend the following activities to be carried out under a Section 90 AHIP permit:

- Monitoring or grader scrapes with raking and/or sieving of sample areas as
 recommended in Strategy C (Monitoring) of Section 8 is to also be undertaken
 in areas of low to moderate disturbance within the study route. This should be
 seen as a 'cultural (not scientific) salvage' exercise unless evidence of high
 research value is found:
- Being aware of the existence of other sites in the Belford area and the nature of their content, it is agreed that Strategy A (Further Investigation) would be seen as inappropriate. However, cultural heritage material may still be present within the subsurface within 100m of Jump Up Creek. Section 8.1 (Hermitage Road Impact Assessment) indicates that a new overpass and approach roads are to be constructed within 100m of the Creek. This area to be impacted by any construction work or for the use as a compound area is to be recorded as containing potential archaeological deposits (PAD). If this area cannot be impact avoided, it is recommended that monitoring of the excavation activities (eg. vegetation clearance and pylon boring) within this area, under the Section 90 AHIP as a 'cultural (not scientific) salvage' for the protection of any archaeological material found unless the evidence is of high research value, is undertaken;
- All four recorded sites are to be salvaged under the Section 90 AHIP;
- All artefacts that are salvaged within the Wanaruah LALC boundary are to be temporarily located at the Land Council under a care agreement and their final interment place is to be determined by the Wongarua Aboriginal stakeholders in consultation at a time to be agreed; and
- With regard to future work on this project, the Wanaruah LALC wishes to be involved in all monitoring and salvage work within the Hermitage Road study area as indicated in Figure 1 of the draft report.
