Subject: Section 75W request to modify the Project Application for the Approved Centre for Obesity, Diabetes and Cardiovascular Disease (CODCD), University of Sydney (MP 09\_0051 MOD 3).

The Department has received a Section 75W modification application, pursuant to the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979* (the Act), from Urbis Pty Ltd on behalf of Brookfield Multiplex (the Proponent) including: to make permanent an existing temporary construction road to the Charles Perkins Centre (former CODCD); minor civil works, landscaping, pedestrian pathway, alter access to Regimental Drive and changes to conditions.
