Hello Colin,

I have received the following from Council's Engineering and Ecology Sections in response to your enquiry:

Ecology

I have considered the proposed modification of the approved Karuah Quarry.

I am content that ecological matters have been appropriately considered and there is not likely to be a significant or unreasonable ecological impact. I understand that the ecological impacts of the modification, although minor, are being addressed by way of mitigation measures.

I do not require additional safeguards or requirements.

Engineering

The proposed extension work is mainly involved in site surface water management, some clearance and earthworks. There would be some impact on access road as the report (SLR Ref 630.12156-R01) indicates grading of road surface back to existing Dam 1 and dam 2, and embankment work. In the absence of additional information or concept drawings, the extent of embankment work, road work, and the resulting impact cannot be determined.

Therefore, no objections are raised to the proposed modification work in engineering point of view, on the basis of measures are in place to assure embankment work and grading on road surface are designed and constructed to relevant standards, the structural capacity of existing road pavement is maintained, and erosion and sediment control measures are in place in accordance with "Blue Book".
