Modification Request – Woodlawn Bioreactor site MP 10_0012 MOD 1 and DA Q91/00233 MOD 2

I refer to your letter, received by the Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) via email on 8 January 2016, in relation to the modification for project approval for the Woodlawn Bioreactor at Collector Road, Tarago. OEH understands that this proposal has been referred by the Department of Planning and Environment pursuant to the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

OEH has reviewed the information provided and is satisfied that the proponent has considered impacts on threatened species. We have no further conditions to recommend other than those already in the existing Approvals.

In relation to Aboriginal cultural heritage matters; OEH notes that Table A.2 Environmental Risk Assessment of the report titled *Woodlawn Bioreactor Modification to surface water and leachate management* (dated 11 December 2015) states that "If unexpected Aboriginal site(s) are found during construction, they would be managed in accordance with Veolia's Environmental Management Plans". OEH advises that we have not been provided with a copy of this plan. As such, while we acknowledge that the modification proposed is already within a disturbed area, we are unable to comment on the adequacy of the proposed management of any unexpected Aboriginal objects.
