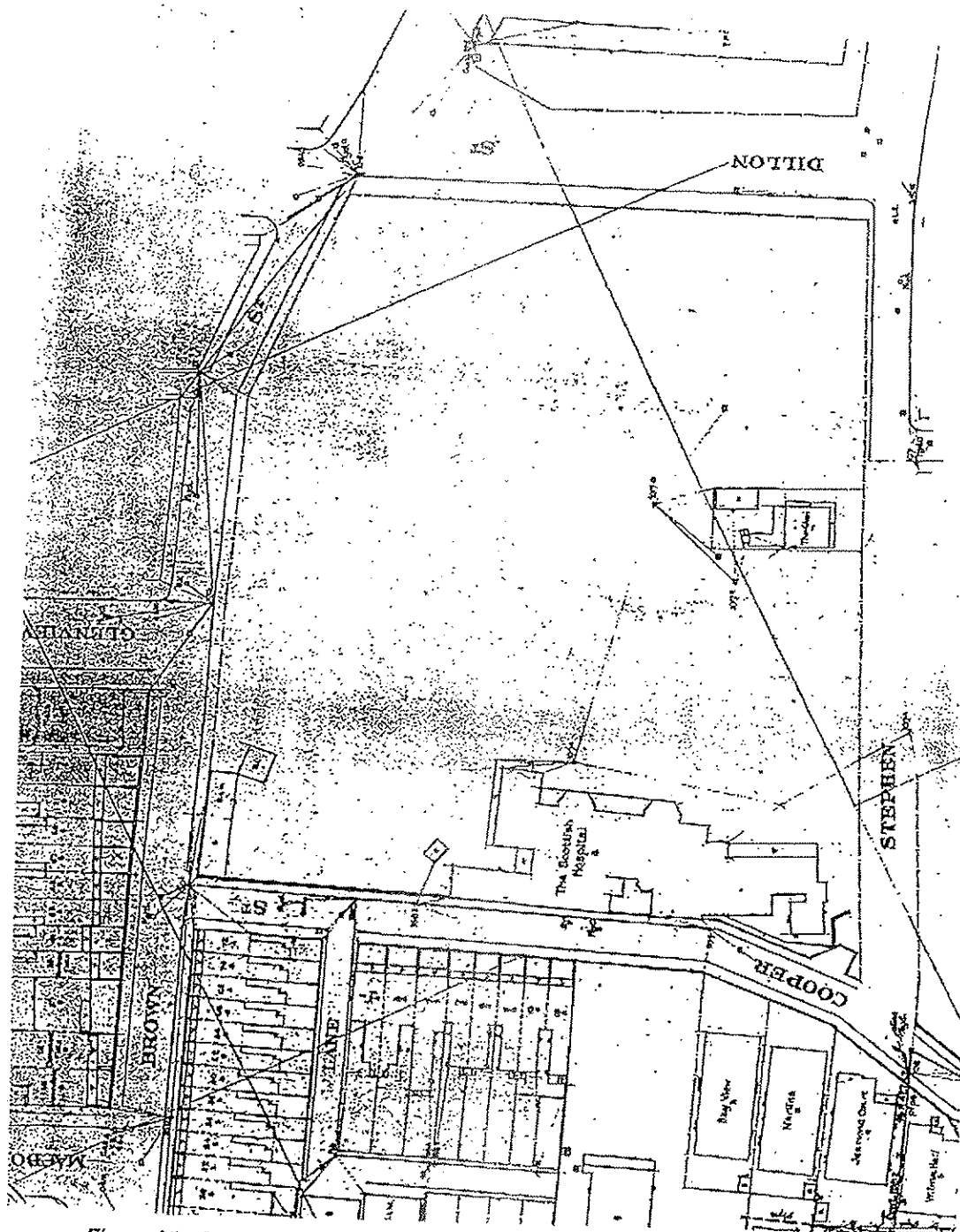


Figure 68 - Survey of the site showing the extent of The Scottish Hospital in 1939.
