## EXHIBITION OF ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT SENIORS LIVING DEVELOPMENT, PADDINGTON (MP10\_0160)

I refer to your letter dated 17 November 2010 seeking advice on the Environmental Assessment for the proposed Seniors Living Development at the Scottish Hospital, 2 Cooper Street, Paddington. Transport NSW appreciates the opportunity to comment on this matter.

Transport NSW (TNSW) has reviewed the Environmental Assessment and the supporting Transport Assessment prepared by Halcrow for the Presbyterian Church (NSW) Property Trust. TNSW considers that the DGRs have generally been satisfactorily addressed in respect of the matters raised.

TNSW, however, requests that a number of matters be resolved to support the objectives, targets and initiatives of the NSW State Plan 2010, the Metropolitan Transport Plan: Connecting the City of Cities, Integrating Land Use and Transport policy package, Planning Guidelines for Walking and Cycling and the Healthy Urban Development Checklist. In particular, Transport NSW requests the provision of:

- 1. End of trip amenities for cyclists, in accordance with the *Planning Guidelines for Walking* and *Cycling*; and
- 2. Travel demand management measures including completion of a location specific Workplace Travel Plan (WTP) and Transport Access Guide.
