



Dillon Reserve Sketch Plan Key

1. Access path (2m width) from Stephen Street through low 1m tall max) native planting. Remove perimeter fence to enhance open inviting space. Can be paved with recycled brick, reminiscent of old local housing stock.
2. Lush mixed groves of low native planting provide enclosure for park users while maintaining site lines to all surrounding areas.
3. Secondary access point from Scottish Hospital site for seniors.
4. Small fitness area with some dedicated exercise equipment.
5. Vegetation to adjoining palisade fence is cleared at this area to allow cross site passive surveillance and open site lines to heritage structures within Scottish hospital site. Dark grey powder coated palisade fence to 1.8m tall.
6. Proposed Dillon Reserve boundary.
7. Opportunity seating areas. Standard council benches to small slab.
8. Large open space lawn area capturing northern sun while retaining existing shade trees.
9. Existing Dillon Reserve boundary.
10. Proposed cross site access path to 2m wide. Remove perimeter fence to enhance open inviting space. Can be paved with recycled brick, reminiscent of old local housing stock.
11. Access path (2m width) from Nield Ave through low (1m tall max) native planting. Remove perimeter fence to enhance open inviting space. Maintain all existing trees
12. Childrens play space incorporating incidental play opportunities nature play and proprietary equipment. Further to this a nature circuit path is incorporated into a WSUD system. Refer point 13. These spaces are semi enclosed by a toddler fence around the northern perimeter between play areas and Nield Avenue.
13. Water Sensitive Urban Design is implemented by the retention of existing walling and some additional grading and planting to provide a stormwater soak and overflow area that doubles as a childrens nature adventure area. Regrading will enable replacement of existing mixed chain mesh fencing with a single simple low palisade fence in one small location. Local sandstone elements can be incorporated as stepping stone paths.
14. Retain all existing trees unless directed otherwise by Woollahra Council.
15. Interfacing standard bench seating.
16. Opportunity for a small path addition to create a tricycle circuit. Move adjacent seats back to planting at boundary.
