## Content:

The heritage documents show that the area for the proposed Pemulwuy Project has heritage significance, due in particular to the impact on it of early railway developments and the establishment of the Eveleigh railway workshops.

Aboriginal people were comparatively late comers to the area, not earlier than the second quarter of last century. They joined the established working class community in connection with work at the railway workshops. With the decline of the economic importance of the railway workshops, the size of the aboriginal population in the area increased comparatively and in absolute. Unfortunately, the area also knew a significant social, economic and moral degradation.

The Pemulwuy Project aims at the transformation of the area into an exclusively aboriginal area. Apart from any other consideration, out of place in the heritage context, the Pemulwuy Project is not consistent with the findings about the heritage significance of the area.

I note incidentally that the author of the report cannot even find a proper place as stakeholders in the area for the long term residents of Caroline and Hugo St, unless he lumps them together with the "passers-by and visitors" to the area.
