Blacktown Council's submission to SSD 23512960 -Upgrades to Glenwood High School at 85 Forman Avenue, Glenwood

1. Engineering issues

The following information is required to allow further assessment of the proposal:

- SQZ file for MUSIC (Model for Urban Stormwater Improvement Conceptualisation) Modelling used for the stormwater quality treatment design and the rainwater tank design.
- b. Digital file for the On-Site Detention Deemed to Comply Design.

2. Traffic issues

a. The traffic report indicates that the provision of onsite car parking will cover only 70% of staff's car parking needs but it is also reported that 92% staff use private vehicle as their mode of travel. This is a concern to Council as this means that 30% of staff will be forced park on surrounding streets, not to mention the parking demand of students that drive to school.

This issue must be addressed adequately to avoid the onsite parking constraints overflowing into the surrounding streets. More justification is required to explain why Council's parking provisions under Blacktown Development Control Plan 2015 cannot be complied with.
