I refer to the development application and Environmental Impact Statement for the Maryvale Solar Farm (SSD-8777).

Following the request for information Maryvale Solar Pty Ltd and pitt&sherry have undertaken the following:

- Consultation with Roads and Maritime Services (Ainsley Bruem, 17/09/2019) to confirm the agreement made in March 2019 regarding the upgrade of the intersection of Cobbora and Maryvale Road includes a short auxiliary left turn meets their requirements. Correspondence was provided to DPIE regarding this on
- Consultation with Dubbo Regional Council (DRC) (Michael Chan/Musarrat Khan, 19/09/2019) to update
 the road upgrade plans to clarify in more detail the extent of works. Updated plans were provided to DRC
 on 2/10/2019 and these were revised to meet DRC comments on 10/10/2019.

Please find attached the updated Site Access Upgrades General Arrangement as well as swept paths to meet the request for additional information.

A summary of the road upgrades is provided in the below table.

The project description within the EIS outlined that ancillary works would also occur in the road reserve along Maryvale and Seatonville Road to facilitate safe access to the Site, which included upgrades to the intersection of Seatonville Road and Maryvale Road, sections of Maryvale Road and the intersection of Maryvale Road and Cobbora Road. These ancillary works were assessed within the EIS and mitigation measures included where relevant. Following detailed design of the road upgrade components, a review of the assessed footprint and potential impacts would be undertaken, and relevant management and mitigation measures will be included Construction Environment Management Plan (CEMP) prepared for the works.

Based on review of desktop mapping all road upgrade works would be confined to the existing road reserve and no crown lands will be impacted.
