Matters discussed	Water Management and general overview of Modification 3		
Notes	The Site visit was conducted on 13 August 2019 with officers from WaterNSW. WaterNSW officers attended to observe the quarry's water management infrastructure. Department of Planning, Industry and Environment (DPIE) Officers attended to gain a general understanding of the quarry to assist with the assessment of the current modification application. Areas of interest shown to the party included: • proximity of the expansion to the Coxs River; • proposed western stockpile area, location of clean water diversions and secondary drainage lines; and • access location to the southern expansion area.		

Primary Outcome – select one Check one	Alex Irwin (Umwelt consultant) directed the group around the quarry focusing initially on water management measures at the request of WaterNSW. The group was shown upper and lower sediment dams and the locations of licensed discharge points into the Coxs River. The site inspection included DPIE and WaterNSW officers also being shown where the mine expansion would be sited. The group was provided access to the top of the existing extraction area (looking north – see PSIMS attachments) where it was identified that the quartzite seam continued to the south. Alex explained that the proposed expansion would require filling of a second order watercourse and the construction of a new clean water diversion channel. WaterNSW stated that it would be assessing this matter in detail in its advice to DPIE. The group was provided access to the western side of the Coxs River tributary. Representatives of Walker Quarries stated that this area would form the western stockpile area only if overburden material was unable to be dispatched offsite (via sales).
