## Attachment 1 – Consideration of Community Views

The Department exhibited the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the proposal from 26 April 2013 until 7 June 2013 (43 days) and received 44 submissions, including 26 objections, 7 comments and 11 in support of the proposal.

The Department also undertook the following consultation activities:

- attended multiple site visits
- met with the Applicant and the EIS consultant to discuss key aspects of the application
- met with Council staff
- met with special interest groups including the Culburra Beach and Districts Chamber of Commerce, Culburra Beach Progress Association and the Lake Wollumboola Protection Association.

In addition, the Commission held a public meeting to hear public views on the proposal.

The key issues raised by the community (including in submissions and during public meetings) include social and economic benefits, impacts on water quality in the Crookhaven River and Lake Wollumboola, flora and fauna and Aboriginal heritage. These and other issues are addressed in detail in the Department's Assessment Report and in the Commission's Statement of Reasons.
