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1 Consultation overview

1.1 Introduction

Infrastructure NSW, on behalf of the NSW Government, is leading the redevelopment of the Sydney International Convention, Exhibition and Entertainment Precinct at Darling Harbour.

Glebe Island Expo is an interim facility planned for Glebe Island in Sydney to support the NSW major events industry while new, state-of-theart convention, exhibition and entertainment facilities are constructed at Darling Harbour during the period December 2013 to December 2016.

Infrastructure NSW is managing the Glebe Island Expo project for the NSW Government. Tenders were sought from companies to design, build, operate and remove Glebe Island Expo and bids were assessed throughout late November and early December 2012.

Infrastructure NSW announced *Sydney Harbour Expo* @*Glebe Island* as the preferred tenderer on 20 December 2012. The company was formed by the leading event and equipment hire company, Pages.

Consultation background

Over the last year, Infrastructure NSW has consulted widely with industry to deliver the Sydney International Convention, Exhibition and Entertainment Precinct at Darling Harbour.

Industry has been clear that large exhibitions, requiring 15,000 square metres or more, would create the biggest challenge whilst facilities at Darling Harbour are closed for construction.

Glebe Island Expo forms part of a Sydney-wide solution to keep the large exhibition industry healthy to transition to the new world-class facilities, supporting an industry, which generates more than \$100 million economic benefit each year for the NSW economy, and is a major employer.

On 17 September 2012, the NSW Government announced Glebe Island Expo, the continued operation of Glebe Island as a working port and an overall interim solution for events while construction takes place at Darling Harbour.

Infrastructure NSW commenced consulting with the community and stakeholders according to the Glebe Island Expo Stakeholder and Community Engagement Approach, prepared in October 2012.

The Glebe Island Expo Stakeholder and Community Engagement Approach lists the stakeholder groups that require engagement from the project team and include:

- community: residents of Leichhardt local government area (LGA) and Pyrmont
- businesses: including local small businesses and business groups
- events industry: businesses directly involved in the industry and their representative bodies
- government: local councils and State Government agencies

1.2 Purpose of consultation

While detailed plans for Glebe Island Expo will be developed by *Sydney Harbour Expo* @*Glebe Island*, Infrastructure NSW has submitted a planning application for an interim exhibition venue.

Community, environmental and amenity issues have been collected by Infrastructure NSW to inform technical studies and the formulation of development proposals for the project. Feedback has been incorporated into the planning application where appropriate. The planning application, including the Environmental Impact Statement will be assessed as part of the planning process by the Department of Planning and Infrastructure.

Members of the community were asked for their feedback on the planning application and the period for public submissions to the Department of Planning and Infrastructure closed on 14 December 2012.



The planning process will continue during the first quarter of 2013. Subject to this approval, Glebe Island Expo is expected to be operating from late 2013 – in advance of construction work starting on the new convention, exhibition and entertainment facilities at Darling Harbour.

1.3 This report

This report is to be submitted to the Department of Planning and Infrastructure as part of the assessment of the planning application for Glebe Island Expo.

It details the consultation methodology and key issues raised during this stage of engagement.



2 Consultation methodology

The Glebe Island Expo Stakeholder and Community Engagement Approach was developed to guide engagement with the community and stakeholders across three broad project phases:

- planning
- construction
- operation

The planning stage began with the announcement by the NSW Government of its intention to construct the interim facility. The planning phase includes:

- pre-lodgement engagement with industry, local government and community representatives
- lodgement of the planning application
- the formal public exhibition period and statutory consultation
- response to feedback
- planning assessment and eventual approval

The engagement methodology for the planning phase is summarised below.

1. One-on-one meetings with key groups and organisations

A series of stakeholder meetings were carried out through August to November 2012 to engage key groups and organisations with a high level of interest in the project, including meetings with:

- Roads and Maritime Services
- Sydney Ports Corporation
- Department of Planning and Infrastructure
- City of Sydney
- Leichhardt Council

- Local business owners

2. Project website

The Sydney International Convention, Exhibition and Entertainment Precinct project website was launched on 17 April 2012 to provide project information, a dedicated project email address and feedback channels for stakeholders on the Darling Harbour project.

Website updates were completed to add project information, news and feedback channels for the interim facility, Glebe Island Expo, in September 2012 to coincide with the NSW Government announcement.

The website has been updated to announce receipt of bids from companies to design, construct, build, maintain and remove Glebe Island Expo, and also the lodgement of the planning application. The media release announcing the successful tenderer, *Sydney Harbour Expo* @*Glebe Island* was published on the website on 20 December 2012. It will continue to be updated to coincide with future project stages.

3. Project Update

Local neighbours including residents, local businesses and community organisations received *Glebe Island Expo Project Update* newsletters to provide the latest information on the project, the planning process and future milestones.

The first *Glebe Island Expo Project Update* was distributed to homes and businesses in the Darling Harbour area via a letterbox drop.



The Glebe Island Expo Project Update contained information about the interim facility planned to support the NSW major events industry, what the facility is expected to offer, a focus on public transport and access to the site, the planning process and timeline, and consultation already underway.

It also contained an invitation to two identical community information sessions, held on Monday 26 November 2012 and Wednesday 28 November 2012. A copy of the newsletter is at Appendix 4.1.

4. Newspaper advertisement

A newspaper advertisement inviting the community to attend the community information sessions appeared in two local papers during November 2012.

The advertisement was published in the Inner West Courier on Tuesday 20 November, and Tuesday 27 November 2012. It was also published in The Central on Wednesday 21 November 2012.

5. Media release

A media release was published on the project website on 15 November 2012 and circulated to key media stakeholders to promote the community information sessions. A copy of the media release is at Appendix 4.2

6. Community information sessions

Two identical community information sessions were held on Monday 26 November and Wednesday 28 November 2012 at The Station community hall Pyrmont, and Balmain Town Hall meeting room respectively. Attended by a total of 31 people, the format of the sessions was informal and 'open house'.

Storyboards with project information were displayed and team members answered questions and heard feedback from participants.

A feedback form was distributed to participants asking questions about what they saw as the important issues that should be considered in the assessment of the planning application. There was also space for general comments and questions on the respondent's profile. Infrastructure NSW received [insert] feedback forms at the sessions, via post and electronically in the week following the second session.
