I object to SSD 7056 for the following reasons:

- 1) Only a few minor changes have been made to the original plans. The proposed building is still an eyesore and not at all compatible with the existing heritage buildings.
- 2) A building on this space will not match the vacant allotment at the southern end of the street, thus upsetting the balance. Aesthetics are very important.
- 3) We do not need a building with increased height in this area, dominating the existing landscape.
- 4) Very little time has been allocated for the general public to object to the amended D.A. The amended document and appendices are long and detailed and require careful reading, not just a quick perusal.
- 5) The Stores need to remain as a focal point in this marvellous part of Sydney. Why do we not learn from past mistakes, that it is imperative to value and highlight our historical sites, as they do overseas?
