Active Transport

TfNSW recommends that the bicycle parking provision should be in accordance with Sydney DCP 2012. Therefore, in addition to the 34 bicycle parking spaces proposed for the development, a further 9 bicycle parking spaces should be provided. Bicycle parking for residential, visitor and customer use should be located in safe and accessible locations as per Section 3.11.3 of the DCP. End of trip facilities for pedestrians and bicycle riders should also be appropriately provided.

Construction Traffic Management

TfNSW requests that a Construction Traffic Management Plan (CTMP) be prepared in accordance with 'Traffic Control at Worksites Manual' (RTA, now Roads and Maritime Services' and in consultation with TfNSW, Council and Roads and Maritime Services prior to the commencement of construction. The CTMP should specify any potential impacts to general traffic, cyclists, pedestrians and bus services within the vicinity of the site from construction vehicles during the construction of the proposed works. Should any impacts be identified, the duration of the impacts and measures proposed to mitigate these should be clearly identified and included in the CTMP.
