Re: SICEEP W1 - Urbanest Student Accommodation

All archaeological requirements have been completed for this area. Casey & Lowe were commissioned by Lend Lease Haymarket Pty Ltd (Lend Lease) to undertake all archaeological work for this site which was completed in August 2014. There were no requirements for Non-Indigenous archaeology in W1 and W2. There was a requirement of testing for Aboriginal archaeology in W1 and based on these results any further requirements for W2 would be identified.

Archaeological testing in W1 identified that the site was very deep below modern ground levels and quite disturbed at depth. The Aboriginal report for W1 stated:

No evidence of Aboriginal occupation was uncovered during the program of subsurface testing. Therefore, this report recommends that there is no objection to the proposed construction of the student housing proceeding. There is no requirement for any further archaeological assessment, monitoring, testing or excavation (Comber Consultants August 2014: Executive Summary).

This statement relates to both W1 and W2.
