The courtyard is afforded excellent surveillance through the location of the W1 reception immediately adjacent and the passing of students through the link bridge at all hours of day/night. All pedestrian routes, entries and internal and external communal areas will be well lit along with lighting to the underside of the bridge link. Entrapment opportunities have been mitigated through a revised amphitheatre design that reduces unused areas. Suitable CCTV cameras will be installed within and around both the W1 and W2 building in appropriate locations with footage available in real time both site on site and remotely in Urbanest's Sydney head office.
2	DRP indicated that the renders do not include the jersey curb on the edge of the roundabout. and that there may be headlight glare of vehicles traversing the roundabout intersection.	Headlights from traffic are only relevant to public common areas on the ground level. Any impacts can be mitigated by appropriate location of functions, interior design and if necessary applied graphic frit treatment to glass at low levels.
