The material of which the Branch is aware leads to a conclusion that the application should be refused on the grounds of potential adverse affectation of water conditions. The science in this field is so imprecise that there are no conditions of consent which can deal with the risk involved.

Even if it were (wrongly) thought the water material is not positive grounds for outright refusal the precautionary principle dictates refusal in the light of the known risk.
