Hi Kane,

Prior to finalisation of the *State Environmental Planning Policy (Koala Habitat Protection) 2019* (SEPP 2019), the NSW Government published the 2016 *Explanation of Intended Effect: State Environmental Planning Policy No 44 – Koala Habitat Protection* with a list of tree species likely to be in the new SEPP.

The tree species listed within the 2016 Explanation of Intended Effect: State Environmental Planning Policy No 44 – Koala Habitat Protection was considered in the BARBOS and RTS.

We have reviewed the two sources, and the tree species listed in the *State Environmental Planning Policy (Koala Habitat Protection) 2019* (SEPP 2019) are similar to the 2016 *Explanation of Intended Effect*, but the following additional trees relating to Koalas in the Northwest Slopes Koala Management Area are noted as occurring in the study area by FloraSearch (2018): *Angophora floribunda, Callitris glaucophylla, Casuarina cristata, Eucalyptus crebra* and *Eucalyptus melanophloia*.

Of the above listed species, *Callitris glaucophylla, Eucalyptus crebra and Eucalyptus melanophloia* were recorded within vegetation communities already considered to be potential Koala habitat.

Angophora floribunda and Casuarina cristata were recorded opportunistically by FloraSearch (2018) but not assigned to a particular community, likely due to their low abundance (see attached species list). Niche (2013) Vickery Coal Project Ecological Assessment) did not record Angophora floribunda in the study area but did record Casuarina cristata as part of a Poplar Box Grassy Woodland community (the equivalent communities in FloraSearch's report are considered potential Koala habitat).
