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Executive Summary

The proposed 50 year Master Plan for Loreto Kirribilli aims to gradually redevelop or replace buildings with dynamic, versatile spaces and studios, which will foster cross-curricular and innovative learning, including STEM; while better utilising the landlocked site and enhancing accessibility across the campus.

It is imperative that the built outcomes of the project truly capture the needs of education and the community to ensure the project achieves the desired result of the brief.

Introduction

Development Application for the redevelopment of Loreto School. The development of the site will be staged and it is envisaged that the stages will take place over a period of up to 50 years.

FJMT Architects have been commissioned by JBA. Loreto Kirribilli to undertaken a concept master plan for the site. The intent of the master plan is to update the current campus towards a more future by the multi disciplinary design team including the __ focussed learning environment and to resolve a following disciplines: number of major accessibility and amenity issues __ Architecture across the campus. The existing building stock __ Structure ranges from the existing heritage buildings of __ Building services the original estate, concrete and masonry cellular __ Façades teaching blocks from the 1960's and 1970's __ Environmental Sustainable Design through buildings developed post 1990's.

For the purposes of the Master plan the site has __ Civil engineering been divided into 5 precincts, each with a different ___ Traffic engineering character:

- _ Campus Core
- Western Precinct
- Southern Precinct _ Eastern Precinct
- _ Northern Precinct

Stage 1 of the Master Plan comprises of the demolition of Block B and the construction of a new Learning Hub to support a STEM curriculum. The Learning Hub interfaces with the existing Gymnasium, providing access to the Gymnasium via a new lift and stairs as well as additional teaching space comprising of a new Learning Studio, Weights Area, relocated Change Rooms, new Storage and Outdoor Learning Area.

This stage also includes three connectors, one located in the Northern Precinct adjacent to the existing Centenary Hall and the Science Block, the Southern Precinct, connecting St Joseph's Block and the Chapel and an interim ramp connector located in the Eastern Precinct between the Science Block and Performing Arts.


