



Useful apps for your smartphone

Want to know how long until the next free shuttle bus? Download the **UOW Shuttle** app, available for iPhone, Windows and Android

Are there available parking spots right now? Find out by downloading the **UOW Parking** app. Both UOW apps are available for iPhone and Android

Need to know more about public transport? Some students have recommended **TripView**, which is available for iPhone, Windows and Android, or Opal **Travel** or **TripGo** for iPhone and Android. Visit uow.edu.au/transport/apps.

Get the **SafeZone** app for iPhone, Android or Windows to be connected directly to UOW Security when you need help, first aid, or a safety escort on campus.

Free shuttle bus and cycling routes



Free Gong Shuttle



The Gong Shuttle is a free NSW Government public bus service. The bus connects Wollongong

CBD and UOW in a loop including Wollongong Station, the Hospital, North Beach, Wollongong Harbour and the Innovation Campus. Catch the bus from Northfields Ave bus interchange (Stands C and D). Route 55A travels anticlockwise, and route 55C travels clockwise.

07:00 – 18:00 every 10 minutes in both directions. 18:00 – 22:00 every 20 minutes in both directions.

08:00 - 18:00 every 20 minutes in both directions.

Free UOW Shuttle Buses

The free **NG Shuttle** NORTH GONG WUOW AUSTRALIA connects the Wollongong Campus to North Wollongong

train station. It is also walking distance from International House and residents of North Wollongong. **Route 9** travels around the University Ring Road, and route 9N goes straight from the station to Northfields Ave bus interchange (Stand A).

The bus meets trains where possible, running frequently from 07:30 – 21:50 on weekdays during session. It also operates during exam periods, including on Saturdays when there are exams. Outside of session, the bus follows the reduced timetable.

UOW GK SHUTTLE BUS

The free **GK Shuttle** connects the Wollongong Campus with Keiraville,

Gwynneville and Wollongong CBD in a loop. Bus stops are close to Weerona College, Keiraview, Marketview, Wollongong CBD, Wollongong Station and the Hospital. **Route GKA** travels anticlockwise, and **route GKC** travels clockwise.

The **GKC shuttle** runs from 08:00 – 22:45 on weekdays during session and exam periods. It operates from the bus interchange (Stand E) on Northfields Ave.

The **GKA shuttle** runs at peak times (08:00 – 10:00, 16:00 – 22:00) on weekdays during session and exam periods. It stops on the southern side of Northfields Ave. opposite the bus interchange (Stand F).

Using public transport

The UOW NG and GK Shuttle buses and the public Gong Shuttle are free of charge. If you are catching a regular bus service or the train you need to pay a fare.

Opal cards are free smartcard tickets that you load money onto and use for public transport (buses, trains, light rail and ferries)

If you are eligible for a Concession Opal card you can receive public transport fares at half the price of an adult fare. Find out more about all concessions and eligibility requirements at uow.edu.au/student/central/travelpasses. If you are not eligible for a Concession Opal card, you will need to get an Adult Opal card. Adult Opal cards are available at the Uni Shop, some newsagents or convenience stores.

Top up facilities for Opal cards are available at train stations (including North Wollongong) and the Uni Shop. Alternatively, you can top up online as required or automatically.



A PLEASANT ENVIRONMENT

In the interest of all passengers, please refrain from smoking, eating, drinking and playing loud music on public transport, at stations and bus stops. The Wollongong and iC campuses are smoke free.

GETTING ON AND OFF THE BUS

To ensure the bus driver sees you waiting, always hail the bus by raising your arm at the stop. To let the driver know you want to alight at the next stop, you should press one of the stop buttons located throughout the bus.

Accessible transport

Trains and most buses have facilities to assist you if you need low floor or wheelchair entry for public transport. Four out of five of the UOW buses are wheelchair accessible.

Persons with a Mobility Permit Scheme card are able to park without charge across campus in marked disabled bays, UOW permit and pay and display ticket car parks. Contact UOW Disability Services for a pass if you wish to park regularly in the multistorey car park (P1).

Train services

North Wollongong Station is the closest to the Wollongong Campus. North Wollongong Station is on the South Coast line, with trains from Sydney, Port Kembla, Kiama and Bomaderry stopping throughout the day. North Wollongong Station is wheelchair accessible. For timetables and a trip planner visit

The free North Gong Shuttle bus runs between North Wollongong Station and the Wollongong Campus to meet trains where possible. See details below left. Alternatively, the station is approximately a 20 minute walk from UOW

Taxi services

Taxis are available at the rank on Northfields Ave, or by calling Wollongong Radio Cabs on (02) 4254 2111. Accessible taxi bookings can be made on (02) 4254 2199.

Cycling and walking

If you live up to 7km from the Wollongong Campus, it's easy to ride your bike or walk, and it can be quicker than driving. Cycling and walking offer great health, social, economic and environmental benefits

There are bike spaces for over 900 bikes on campus, including six secure bike bases on campus where you can lock up your bike and get access to showers, toilets, change rooms and lockers. These are available for staff and students. See uow.edu.au/transport/cycling for details.

All paths at UOW are shared walking and cycling paths. Cyclists can also use the roads around campus, but please take care. Be courteous when riding around pedestrians and use your bell to alert those who can't see you. Please note that bikes cannot be chained to trees, light posts, railings or buildings, and can be impounded by Security. UOW Security recommend the use of a D lock. Under NSW legislation you are required to wear a properly fitted helmet, carry ID and have front and rear lights and reflectors on your bike. If you are walking, please walk in well-lit areas, with friends, and

use safety escorts on campus if walking alone to your car at night. Find out more about security and walking escorts at uow.edu.au/about/security.

Parking at UOW

At UOW, parking is limited, in high demand and expensive. During session there can be more than 16,000 people on campus each day, but there are only 3,000 parking spaces. Congestion during peak periods of session can cause delays and be stressful Use the parking guidance system signs around campus or ask a passenger to check the UOW Parking app to avoid wasting time searching for spaces. To avoid these problems, consider walking, cycling or using public transport where practicable. If you have to drive, consider carpooling to receive free parking with three or more people. 
Carpooling at UOW free parking

Carpool to UOW with three or more people in a car and get free **parking**! Arrive at the Western carpark (P4) carpooling area from 07:30 and see the parking attendant to receive free parking.


Carpooling is intended to help those travelling from further afield where public transport is not as convenient, and to reduce greenhouse emissions. It is not acceptable to pick up additional passengers in and around the campus, and offenders will be refused parking for the rest of the session.
