

6.1 The Concept

Following consultation with key stakeholder groups of the school and the wider school community, concept options were developed. These options considered the opportunities to reuse the existing school building, the relationship with the public park and opportunities for shared sporting facilities and significantly the ability to deliver key project aims of an integrated school with future focused learning opportunities that fostered collaboration and an integrated approach to learning that was stage based and facilitated a meaningful educational journey for all students. These concepts considered the following key issues:

- Maximising play space through use of on ground and roof top zones
- Maximising the ability to provide a meaningful connection the adjacent park to benefit the community and school
- Providing an integrated school with vertical and horizontal connections on all levels
- Fostering community connections to key facilities of sports halls, library spaces and specialist learning studios
- Minimising the vertical exceedance of the 15m height limit, acknowledging adjacent residential developments.

6.1.1 Endorsed Concept - Clouds

While all options met the functional brief and would deliver a comprehensive K-12 school that fully embraced innovative learning pedagogies, it was the option called 'Clouds' that best addressed the aspirations of the school for a fully connected and spirited learning community. Other options were far less successful in delivering the idea of a true community school and specifically did not embrace the connection of the outdoor learning spaces and the park in any meaningful way.

'Clouds' at its core embraced the idea of a community focused precinct that was inviting and fostered a greater sense of community engagement. By locating the built elements along the western boundary, the new school would present an animated backdrop to a more expansive outdoor parkland of Alexandria Park and maximised the opportunity for a consolidation of all outdoor play spaces within the school site. The new entry precinct and a comprehensive shared sporting zone offer great opportunities for community connections.

The formal expression of this option most directly reflects the learning pedagogies of learning hubs that are envisaged in the educational model - both in the primary and high school learning precincts. It fosters the key concept of stage based learning and physically delivers this concept in an integrated way. With the primary school located in the more protected southern zone and a central community hub of administrative and staff areas coupled with the core library elements and community service providers, this concept provides great opportunities for parent inclusion in education and student welfare and particularly in early years of school education.

Locating the high school elements in the northern zone extending over all 5 levels will allow for community use of specialist facilities such as the fitness, drama and food technology workshops (which are located at the ground level) while general learning and senior study elements have a direct vertical connection to the library and other informal collaborative spaces of the specialist hubs.

The sporting zone and fitness and wellbeing facilities are all co-located and allow for future expansion with additional facilities should funding become available through joint ventures with other community organisations. This is envisaged in the concept and will maximise the ability to make a fully integrated community school.
