PLANNING PROCESS

A Master Plan for Walsh Bay Arts and Cultural Precinct was prepared in 2013 outlining a vision for an enhanced and integrated public arts and cultural destination on Sydney Harbour.

The Master Plan included redevelopment of Pier 2/3 for new arts facilities and performance venues, refurbishment of existing facilities in Wharf 4/5 and creation of a new public domain with a Waterfront Square.

A Staged State Significant Development Application (SSDA) process to realise the Master Plan vision commenced in 2014 with consent for Stage 1 granted in May 2015. A Stage 2 application process commenced in 2016 and proceeded to exhibition in November 2016.

An objection to the Stage 1 consent was heard in the Court of Appeal in 2017. The Court ruled that the Stage 1 consent be declared invalid and set aside. As a consequence, the Stage 2 application was withdrawn.

The NSW Government remains committed to the creation of a public arts and cultural destination at Walsh Bay. Key to achieving this is the redevelopment of Pier 2/3 and refurbishment of Wharf 4/5 in line with the 2013 Master Plan.

To achieve this commitment, the NSW Government has lodged a new SSDA which seeks approval for the construction and operation of Pier 2/3 and Wharf 4/5 for arts and cultural uses with complementary commercial and retail offerings to activate the precinct.



All dates are subject to planning approval and construction timeframes.




Illustration of the proposed Pier 2/3

REVISED PLANS: WHARF 4/5




Illustration of the proposed Wharf 4/5
