The majority of pits that Council use to source roadbase are located on private land and we extract the material under an agreement with the land owner and pay royalties for any material extracted. We also pay for the extraction of the material (eg excavation, crushing and removal)

Should you wish to use this pit you would have to make enquiries with the leasee of the land that the pit is located on. As Chris noted, as we understand it this pit has been inactive for several years and we can not provide any details of the remaining material available in the current pit nor whether it could be expanded to access new material

Please find attached a map of the mineral resources audit from Resources & Energy (not sure what the current name of the Govt Dept is) showing the current quarries and pits in Yass Valley.

You will see from the plan the Tallagandra Pit is used for roadbase.
