Decision

Reasons for decision

The following matters were taken into consideration in making this decision:

- the relevant matters listed in section 4.15 of the Act and the additional matters listed in the statutory context section of the Department's Assessment Report;
- the prescribed matters under the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2000;
- the reasons given by the consent authority for the grant of the original consent;
- the objects of the Act;
- the considerations under s 7.14(2), 7.16(3) and 7.17(2) of the Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016 (NSW);
- all information submitted with the modification application during the assessment and information considered in the Department's Modification Assessment Report;
- the findings and recommendations in the Department's Modification Assessment Report;
- · the submissions made concerning the modification; and
- the views of the community about the project (see Attachment 1).

The findings and recommendations set out in the Department's Modification Assessment Report were accepted and adopted as the reasons for making this decision.

The decision maker was satisfied that the development to which the consent as modified relates is substantially the same development as the development for which consent was originally granted was modified.

The key reasons for granting the modification are as follows:

- the modification is permissible with consent and is consistent with NSW Government policies.
- the impacts on the community and the environment can be appropriately minimised, managed or offset to an
 acceptable level, in accordance with applicable NSW Government policies and standards.
- the issues raised by the community during consultation and in submissions have been considered and adequately addressed through changes to the project and the recommended conditions of consent.
- weighing all relevant considerations, the modification is in the public interest.

The Department exhibited the modification from 10 October 2019 to 8 November 2019 (30 days) and received 14 submissions, including 10 submission from public authorities (with comments from Tweed Shire Council), two objections from the members of the community, one comment and one letter of support. One additional correspondence from a member of the community, objecting to the proposal was received after close of exhibition period.

The key issues raised by the community and Tweed Shire Council (Council) considered in the Department's Modification Assessment Report and by the decision maker include traffic and transport, built form and visual impacts. Other issues are addressed in detail in the Department's Modification Assessment Report.

The traffic modelling results indicate that subject to the implementation of the upgrade works, the identified intersection would have an acceptable level of service in the future. All other nearby intersections have been modelled and the results indicate that the intersections would perform at an acceptable level of service in the future. The upgrade works have been proposed in consultation with Council and Transport for NSW (Roads and Maritime Services). Based on the comments from Council and the Applicant's assessment, the Department considers that the proposed increase in the hospital capacity would be accommodated within the surrounding road network, subject to implementation of the proposed intersection upgrade and necessary traffic mitigation measures in Stage 2. The appropriateness of the mitigation measures would be assessed in detail in the Stage 2 application. Given that the hospital would not be operational until the completion of Stage 2, the Department is satisfied that the modification application itself would not result in any adverse traffic impacts on the surrounding road network due to emergency vehicles or hospital beds. Conditions Conditions include: The Stage 2 application detail all additional intersection upgrade works to mitigate the impacts in the following scenarios: 391 beds and 1120 staff by 2023. 443 beds and 1300 staff by 2033. 499 beds post 2033, including the additional 56 in patient unit beds.
