RESIDENT SUBMISSION

Background

This submission relates to the application by Sell & Parker "to increase the capacity of the Kings Park Metal Recovery to receive and process up to 600,000 tonnes per annum from 350,000 tonnes per annum".

Noise

In simple but important terms, I am one of the residents living to the East of Sell & Parker's facility and wish to make it known on behalf of myself and my family that:

- a. we hear a lot of noise at various times from early morning to late evening (appreciating Sell & Parker can operate from 6am to 9pm Monday to Saturday excluding public holidays, and they use heavy duty and loud shears and shredders)
- b. whilst some days/parts of the day are tolerable (ie, little noise), **many days/large parts of the day are bad** (ie, can be heard within the home/**sound like a construction site**)
- c. the noise is highly uncomfortable and unpleasant (ie, sharp loud metal banging)
- d. the **noise adversely impacts** our ability to enjoy our homes and yards, appreciating Sell & Parker can operate for **15 hours a day, 6 days a week**
- e. the **noise negatively impacts** on sleep (ie, sleeping past 6am or before 9pm is difficult) and the ability to work-from-home both for the reason that the noise can be heard inside the home
- f. the **noise detrimentally impacts** our mental health and well-being because of the intrusion into the comfort we should be able to enjoy in our own homes
- g. whilst we appreciate Sell & Parker have a business to operate, a proper balance and **enforceable protection for residents** should be an equally high expectation and outcome
- h. our priority therefore is on **ensuring a permanent solution to the noise problem for residents**
- i. accordingly whilst we <u>STRONGLY OPPOSE AND OBJECT</u> to the application based on the noise experiences to date, IF it is nevertheless approved then we <u>STRONGLY</u> <u>REQUEST</u> that it be a mandatory condition of consent that:
 - i. their **hours of operation are reduced** to be more reasonable for the comfort of residents 15 hours a day, 6 days a week is just too much
 - ii. much **higher, thicker and best quality acoustic fences/sound baffles** within Sell & Parker's premises be built and maintained (eg, minimum 15-20 metres high) that span the whole of the Eastern perimeter of their premises (ie, facing Sunnyholt Road) and also as far as possible down the Southern perimeter of their premises (ie, facing Forge Street), and without any gaps

- iii. all **other noise elimination/minimisation measures are implemented** (to the extent possible)
 - eg, ensuring any noise reducing options/attachments to machinery are properly installed, maintained and utilised
 - eg, where practicable, placing machinery/other noise barriers in a position on the site that would provide the most optimal benefit for residents in respect of noise elimination/minimisation
 - eg, wherever there is a choice of acoustic options, selecting the option that produces the best possible outcome for residents in terms of noise elimination/minimisation
 - eg, adopting best practice standards and going beyond bare minimums
 - eg, having the best form of noise elimination/minimisation barriers in place

Complaints

- a. numerous **complaints** have been made to the **EPA** regarding the noise problems residents experience – the details of those complaints can (presumably) be supplied by the EPA and we strongly and respectfully request that those complaints be obtained and given a high level of importance and consideration
- b. numerous **complaints** have also been made directly to **Sell & Parker**, a copy of which is **attached**, and which can be accessed at:

again, we strongly and respectfully request that those complaints be accessed and given a high level of importance and consideration

- c. these complaints should be regarded as representative for all affected/impacted residents and the **tip-of-the-iceberg** as residents could literally complain almost every day (except Sundays and public holidays) because the noise is frequent and intrusive, and appreciating that:
 - i. there are hundreds and hundreds of residents within close/reasonable proximity to the facility who are affected/impacted
 - ii. the noise emitted by Sell & Parker does travel quite far
- d. despite these complaints and the concerns raised by residents, the noise problem remains and this causes a great deal of discomfort and distress for residents both presently and in respect of what the future may hold

Resident and Local Worker Petition

- a. **attached** is a petition signed by various residents and local workers that we have been privy to (and assisted with), and which we strongly and respectfully request be taken into account and given a high level of importance and consideration
- b. when reading same, please appreciate that:
 - i. it takes a lot of time to speak with residents and local workers and collate signatures keeping in mind residents might not be home when door-knocked, we needed to juggle door-knocking with our own family and work commitments, it only commenced to be prepared on 21 October 2020 (and the deadline for submissions is 29 October 2020), and recent wet and windy weather has hampered efforts to gain more signatures
 - ii. to put the percentage of resident signatures into perspective, only various homes on Turner Street, part of Charles Street, and a small portion of houses on each of Anthony Street, Frederick Street, Raymond Street, Lavender Place, Northcott Road (the area between Turner Street and Lavender Place) and Garden Street were able to be door-knocked (given the limitations mentioned above) – **thus, in percentage terms an overwhelming substantial majority of residents experience noise problems associated with Sell & Parker's operations**
 - iii. we strongly and respectfully submit that a similar high ratio of concern regarding the noise problems associated with Sell & Parker's operations would reasonably be expected to be seen across the broader residential community within close/reasonable proximity to their facility (if time permitted more door-knocking to occur)

Council

a. we are aware that our local Blacktown Council is also concerned by the impact Sell & Parker's operations have had and continue to have on residents and especially those to the East of the facility, and in this respect we **attach** a copy of their prior letter to DPIE and draw your attention to the paragraph about residents to the East of the facility on page 1

Residential / Industrial Area

- a. this is <u>not</u> a situation where Sell & Parker operate in an isolated industrial area, rather Sell & Parker are on the doorstep of a well established and large residential community in North Blacktown which encompasses parts of Blacktown, Lalor Park and Kings Langley hence the need for significant noise prevention measures to be implemented
- b. in addition, an **Early Learning Centre** and **Lynwood Park Public School** are both located on Turner Street, Blacktown which is in very close proximity to Sell & Parker
- c. given the residential area existed well before Sell & Parker's operations commenced in Kings Park (and especially before the significant expansion of their operations at that site in recent years), we strongly and respectfully submit that it is only fair and reasonable that Sell & Parker be required to take all necessary steps to redress the intrusion their operations have on residents

d. as many existing homes are on large blocks of land in the North Blacktown area (up to approx 1,000m²), we consider it a reasonable assumption to make that more duplexes, granny flats, villas and townhouses will be built on such blocks (which has already occurred and is continuing to occur), meaning that more and more residents will call North Blacktown home and who will be adversely affected by the noise emissions from Sell & Parker

Noise Report

- a. whilst we are aware of the noise report submitted by Renzo Tonin & Associates, with due respect to the author, it does <u>NOT properly represent or reflect the ACTUAL</u> <u>experiences of residents – residents complain and are very concerned because of</u> <u>what they ACTUALLY hear (please refer again to the EPA complaints, complaints to</u> <u>Sell & Parker and the resident and local worker petition)</u>
- b. we encourage and invite anyone who has not heard the noise to stand on Charles Street, Frederick Street, Anthony Street, Raymond Street, Eggleton Street, Turner Street, Garden Street, Allen Road, Fern Place, Stephen Street, Lavender Place, Wistaria Place, Rosemary Place and all other surrounding areas when Sell & Parker are operating all of their shears and shredders to fully appreciate the **volume, frequency and type of noise residents endure between 6am and 9pm Monday to Saturday** excluding public holidays
- c. the noise generated by Sell & Parker can be heard notwithstanding such things as the bus T-Way acoustic wall on Sunnyholt Road (noting there are large gaps in that wall where roads intersect with Sunnyholt Road, it is not that high when measured in light of the height of the machinery on Sell & Parker's premises, and many houses on the Eastern side of Sunnyholt Road are elevated up from Sunnyholt Road), surrounding buildings (which are essentially low-rise) and fluctuating levels of traffic on Sunnyholt Road

Conclusion

- a. whilst we appreciate the need to co-exist with Sell & Parker, as they create the noise we believe it is only fair and reasonable that **they take all necessary steps to address and resolve the noise concerns of residents**
- b. we strongly and respectfully request that the **views and considerations of residents have a substantial bearing** in the DPIE decision-making process in order to endeavour to achieve a satisfactory and beneficial outcome for residents
- c. for clarity, whilst our preference is for the application by Sell & Parker to be refused, we nevertheless stress the vital and critical importance of the need for noise elimination/mitigation measures as a condition of consent should it be approved (and which we respectfully submit Sell & Parker should be desiring to implement and achieve anyway if they wish to be regarded as good corporate citizens)

Other

a. we are aware other residents may express the same or similar views as we all suffer from the noise that Sell & Parker create

ATTACHMENT A

The following items are requested to be included in the draft SEARS:

1. Environmental Health

1.1 Air Quality Impact Assessment

- a) An air impact assessment must be conducted by a suitably qualified expert in line with the *Approved Methods and Guidance for the Modelling and Assessment of Air Pollutants in NSW* (EPA 2011) which includes:
 - All processes and scenarios that could result in air pollution and/or generation of odour, this must also include worst case scenarios.
 - An assessment of the air quality impacts arising from the project on surrounding sensitive receptors (particularly dust and odour).
 - Provide an air pollutant management plan that includes details of the various methods that will be employed to control pollutants during the operational phase of the development.
 - The accumulative impact of this proposal along with adjacent development, particularly that to the west of the site.

1.2 Noise Impact Assessment

- a) Determine the existing background ambient noise levels in accordance with the *NSW Industrial Noise Policy, 2000.*
- b) Determine the existing road traffic noise levels in accordance with the *NSW Road Noise Policy*.
- c) Conduct a noise assessment by a suitably qualified consultant in accordance with *NSW Industrial Noise Policy, 2000* that:
 - Identifies all existing and proposed noise sources, including animal noises.
 - Identifies any noise sensitive locations which may be affected by activities.
 - Quantifies the cumulative noise impacts upon the surrounding receivers.
 - Assesses all construction noise associated with the proposal using the *Interim Construction Noise Guideline* (DECC, 2009).
 - Specifies the proposed operating hours and includes an assessment of the maximum noise levels during the night-time period (10pm-7am) when additional activities are planned.
 - Assesses any increased road traffic generated at the premises.
 - Assesses the noise impact associated with use of access roads, internal roads and potential environmental impacts from increased vehicle movements and increased operational activities as a result of the proposal.
- d) Outline the noise management and mitigation measures including appropriate controls for operational noise.
- e) The accumulative impact of this proposal along with adjacent development, particularly that to the west of the site

1.3 Waste Management

- a) Identify all waste streams both incoming and outgoing from the premises in accordance with the EPA's Waste Classification Guidelines.
- b) Provide details regarding the source, quantity and types of all wastes that will be generated, accepted, handled, processed or treated.
- c) Provide details regarding the proposed transportation, receipt and handling of waste generated.
- d) Detail the extent of any waste that is to be stockpiled including:
 - Estimated average and maximum amount of materials to be stored at any one time.
 - Stockpile heights.
 - The approximate locations of these stockpiles.
 - Proposed containment of materials and stockpiles.
 - Fire management and odour from any green waste stockpiles.
- e) Assess the estimated emissions arising from the handling, storage, treatment, processing and reprocessing of waste at the site.

1.4 Surface Water and Wastewater Management

- a) Describe the intake and discharge of water at the site including:
 - Volumes;
 - Water quality; and
 - Frequency of all water discharges.
- b) Assess and provide details of all surface water, groundwater and wastewater impacts that are likely to occur during and as a result of discharges at the site.
- c) Assess all surrounding water bodies and receiving waters that are likely to be affected by the proposal.
- d) Describe any control measures to be implemented that minimise wastewater generation, erosion, and sediment mobilisation during the operational phase of the proposal.
- e) Describe how stormwater will be managed having regard to the utilisation of existing infrastructure and demonstrating how the existing infrastructure can cope with the increased intensity of the use.
- f) Describe how predicted impacts will be monitored and assessed over time.

2. Engineering

Any Civil Engineering Works must follow *Blacktown City Council's Engineering Guide for Development – 2005* to facilitate the efficient processing of engineering plan submissions, and to ensure that infrastructure associated with any development is designed and constructed to be safe, serviceable, economical to maintain and meets community expectations.

3. Stormwater Drainage

- **3.1** All development including carparks are to be above the 1 in 100 year ARI flood level. Any building floor levels are to be above the 1 in 100 year ARI flood level plus 0.5 m.
- **3.2** Prepare a revised Flood Management Plan for the site having regard to the extra activities proposed to be occurring and the additional staff and visitors likely to be present on the site.
- **3.3** Ensure that the existing stormwater management of the site meets our requirements and that there is no need for additional measures to be implemented and, if there are, that we are provided with ample opportunity to assess this.

4. Traffic Management

- 4.1 Additional traffic volumes. We request that a traffic and parking analysis report prepared by a suitably qualified person be sought in the draft SEARs.
- 4.2 The accumulative impact of this proposal along with adjacent industrial development, particularly that to the west of the site

5. Planning Matters

- **5.1** That previous requirements in relation to SSD 5041 (approved on 12 November 2015) and its subsequent modifications also be required with respect to this expansion.
- **5.2** The EIS is to demonstrate that appropriate facilities are available to serve the needs of the (additional?) staff.
- **5.3** We note the comprehensive scoping report submitted. We ask you to ensure that the matters listed in the report be requested of the applicant and addressed in the EIS.
- **5.4** That the applicant be required to address in the EIS all relevant environmental planning instruments and DCPs, including, but not limited to:
 - State Environmental Planning Policy (Infrastructure) 2007
 - State Environmental Planning Policy 33 (Hazardous and Offensive Development)
 - State Environmental Planning Policy 55 (Remediation of Land)

- Blacktown LEP 2015
- Blacktown DCP 2015

Also, the requirements for an EIS prescribed by Schedule 2 of the Environmental Planning & Assessment Regulation 2000 and other relevant legislation as highlighted in Part 5 of the Scoping Report.

- **5.5** We request that landscaping, particularly around the perimeter of the site and adjacent to Breakfast Creek, continue to be improved and embellished and that this be requested of the applicant to address in the EIS. The same applies to fencing and perimeter, machinery and building acoustic treatment.
- **5.6** That the applicant adequately address employee and visitor safety, including a fire and incident management strategy.
- **5.7** That the Scoping Meeting outcomes be requested to be addressed in the EIS in their entirety.
- **5.8** That the applicant be directed to obtain and comply with all relevant licensing required by other agencies, including liaising with the Environment Protection Authority.
- **5.9** That the Department consider whether it should request the applicant to surrender previous consents/approvals and that the use be consolidated into one consent (should consent be granted). Land uses and sites operating with multiple consents and approvals have proven to be problematic in our experience.
