I love living here for So many reasons, some of the effects of the severe amount of water loss are, 1. All year you can step out on too our balcony and see a range of birds from king parrots to black cockatoos and taking their main source of water that all the animals rely on, and who will be responsible ending the sheer amount of life in the bush around Bridge Creek. 2. We have a bike track running past the bottom of our house and it is shaded by all this vegetation that is also relying on the creek water and I love to be able to walk my back gate and ride to Manly or walk to the library and be able see all the flora and fauna are on the way. 3. We also have very good schools here which backs onto the creek and has tons of trees that would if they were to die would fall into the school costing so much money to get rid of them, to make it safe for kids, and to repair the damage would've caused would cost the school a lot of money to fix the school fence they the damage. These are just three reasons why you cannot let this tunnel be built here and block the Burnt Bridge Creek's extremely important water flow.
