I refer to the Department's below email of 22 October 2021 regarding the Response to Submissions (RtS) report for the request for State Significant Development SSD-8865-Mod-1 St Anthony of Padua Catholic School Redevelopment for proposed amendments to project staging, site layout, the composition of outdoor and indoor recreational facilities, building bulk and scale including a reduction in total gross floor area, and minor changes to drop-off / pick-up area at 125-165 Tenth Avenue and 140-170 Eleventh Avenue, Austral (Lots 810, 811, 812, 840, 841, 842 DP 2475; Lots 1 & 2 DP 1232692). Network Capacity / Connection	Endeavour Energy has noted from the Section 4.55(2) Modification Report the proposed amendments do not appear to have a direct or significant impact on the existing or required electricity infrastructure. Notwithstanding the proposed amendments the recommendations and comments provided therein essentially remain valid.	Noted- no action required.

Although the RtS report proposes project amendments to the modification as lodged, again they do not appear to have a direct or significant impact on the existing or required electricity infrastructure. Accordingly Endeavour Energy has no further advice and the recommendations and comments previously provided essentially remain valid.


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Please note the location, extent and type of any electricity infrastructure, boundaries etc. shown on the plan is indicative only. In addition it must be recognised that the electricity network is constantly extended, augmented and modified and there is a delay from the completion and commissioning of these works until their capture in the model. Easements benefitting Endeavour Energy are indicated by red hatching. Generally (depending on the scale and/or features selected), low voltage (normally not exceeding 1,000 volts) is indicated by blue lines and high voltage (normally exceeding 1,000 volts but for Endeavour Energy's network not exceeding 132,000 volts / 132 kV) by red lines (these lines can appear as solid or dashed and where there are multiple lines / cables only the higher voltage may be shown). This plan only shows the Endeavour Energy network and does not show electricity infrastructure belonging to other authorities or customers owned electrical equipment beyond the customer connection point / point of supply to the property. This plan is not a 'Dial Before You Dig' plan under the provisions of Part 5E 'Protection of underground electricity power lines' of the *Electricity Supply Act 1995* (NSW).



Supply for the St Anthony of Padua Catholic School Redevelopment is provided by the two new padmount substations no.s 54761 and 57762 (indicated by the symbol ) to the Eleventh Avenue road frontage and over which an easement and restrictions will need to be registered on title in accordance with Endeavour Energy's Mains Design Instruction MDI 0044 'Easements and Property Tenure Rights'. The overhead power lines have now largely been removed / undergrounded.
