SUBMISSION COCKLE BAY WHARF MIXED USE DEVELOPMENT SSD-9978934

Although the State Significant Development Cockle Bay Wharf Mixed Use development currently on exhibition has some positive features, we **OBJECT IN PRINCIPLE** to the construction of yet another oversized tower on Darling Harbour.

-1- POSITIVE ASPECTS

-1a- Northern Park

The project proposes the construction of a massive land bridge structure over Wheat Rd and the Western Distributor in order to:

- provide a seamless connection between Darling Harbour and the CBD by covering the existing noisy and polluting 2-level road system (southern access to the Harbour Bridge) which currently separates them.

- allow the development of a 5,500m2 public park over the distributor.

Downside: the public park (RL19.0) is located 7.5m above the Pyrmont Bridge (RL11.5). The two are linked by an unattractive flight of stairs and escalators.



-1b- Monorail station removal


The disused monorail station (the service was terminated in 2013, 8 years ago!) would be removed.

-2- OFFICE TOWER

We strongly object to the construction of a 35-storey office tower on Darling Harbour.

- The tower is taller (+13m) and much wider than its counterpart across Darling Harbour (proposed Harbourside Shopping Centre redevelopment).

- It is too close to the heritage-listed Pyrmont Bridge.



- It would overshadow Darling Harbour adding, although at different hours of the day, to the shadow of the Harbourside Tower.

Finally, we do not believe an additional 75,000m2 of office space is needed at a time when many people are now working from home.

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
