Submission in relation to Silverleaf Solar Farm SSD-9358

PB&MJ Smith 'Bellevue' Narrabri NSW 2390

- 1. We are the owners of land adjoining the development site.
- 2. We own lot 2/1142181.
- 3. We understand Mr Peter Dampney owns lot 373A/186621 & lot 1/566857 which also join the development site to the south.
- 4. We understand AGT owns lot 286/754944.
- 5. We have not been approached at any stage by the proponents in relation to the proposed development.
- 6. The applicant's EIS appears to suggest the neighbour to the south is only AGT, however this is not correct.
- 7. On one occasion Marcus Dowling spoke to me but that was in relation to a transmission line across another of our properties known as '*Bellevue*' being lot 6/224780.

Overland Flows

- 8. The development site is affected by overland flows.
- 9. The overland flows are focused on the southern boundary where we are the neighbours.
- 10. These overland flows known as Back Creek run from east to west (not west to east as suggested in the EIS) and occur as a result of significant catchment drainage on the eastern side of the Newell Highway.
- 11. The overland flows run under the Newell Highway at a point immediately north of the Greg Colyvan's residence which is on Lot 2 DP 586990 and flow in a westerly direction within the development site.
- 12. The flows in terms of volume and velocity are very significant in times of heavy rain.
- 13. The flows run across the proposed development site from east to west.
- 14. As the overland flows move west from the Newell Highway, they are harvested by us and by Mr Dampney and form a very important and critical water resource for our respective farming operations.
- 15. Both ourselves and Mr Dampney have incurred considerable expense installing water offtake structures to allow us to harvest the overland flows.
- 16. The water offtake structures are designed to allow overland flows from Back Creek to run into a water storage dam located on our property.

- 17. The water offtake structures **do not** control the overland flow they simply collect some of the overland flow for reuse as the overland flow runs past our land.
- 18. The harvesting of the overland flows is regulated by Water NSW and forms part of our water licence arrangements.
- 19. It is critical that the overland flows are not blocked or diverted even a minor structure or earthwork in the wrong place will divert the overland flows away from our established intake structure.
- 20. We are particularly concerned in relation to any structure which might be built in the floodway, and in particular any fencing which may be constructed across the floodway.
- 21. We ask that the proponent address the issue of the Back Creek overland flows and provide us with a guarantee that the floodway which is the Back Creek overland flows will be preserved.
- 22. We also ask that the proponent undertake to ensure that the development acknowledges and addresses the potential significant flows which occur from time to time within Back Creek.

Other matters

- 23. We grow cotton on lot 2/1142181 and have done for some years. From time to time we use aerial spraying on the crop planted on that lot.
- 24. We are unsure as to whether cotton growing is compatible with a solar farm, however we place the proponent on notice in this regard.
- 25. We note also that we have, from time to time, seen koalas in the location.
