I have lived in Upper Cliff Road, Northwood for nearly 60 years.



I look directly across the gully to the existing hospital. Most of the western end of the hospital building is clearly visible.

The proposed development will dwarf the existing buildings, along the same gully boundary and further destroy the bushland feel of my home.

<u>Every objection</u> I have read details the negative visual impact of the development, its bulk and size and the loss of amenity for local residents and surrounding areas.

Accordingly, one of the most critical expert reports that the Secretary will rely upon in his determination has to be the Visual Impact Statement

The Secretary can have no confidence in this "independent" report and its conclusions.




Why did the expert decide not to choose an Upper Cliff Road location!!??!!

Instead, the Secretary will <u>only</u> have the above Northwood photomontage for his consideration. Rubbish!!

Remarkably, the Statement concluded that the overall visual impact <u>even from this Northwood location</u> was still at the "<u>Moderate / High</u>" rating!!??!!

The unzoned Seniors Living blocks (x2) <u>force the developer</u> to utilise the site to create the horrendous high rise Hospital block. Without the Seniors Living, the Hospital could be designed in a more sympathetic way, with proper regard to the irreplaceable natural beauty of the surrounding areas.

What does the expert now have to say about my "visual impact rating"!!??!!
