We have previously farmed in this area and know it to be good productive agricultural land. Our family have been farming in this particular district for 110 years.

The loss of productive crop, hay and grazing land will be a great loss in our community and will have long lasting effects.

The jobs that will supposedly be gained in our area will not be of benefit to Culcairn and Walla. Maybe some labour may be sourced from Albury, but the benefit will have little effect in the Culcairn and Walla communities, and the same for accommodation benefits. Will have little effect here as employees will probably live in Albury and commute daily.

We are not opposed to renewable energy, but we are against the location of the solar farm on good productive agricultural land. Solar farms should be situated on less arable land of which there is plenty out western New South Wales. Lobby governments to have transmission lines put out west and then put solar farms there.
